We have all heard the adage that says that it takes a village to raise a child. Well, at River Oaks Elementary we know that it takes a village to graduate intelligent, creative and knowledgeable students. We know that when we work as a team, we develop the many skills, attitudes and attributes that make our students productive members of the community and the world. Every 5th grader, as a culmination of learning in the Primary Years Program of IB, participates in The Exhibition. The Exhibition is a student-driven inquiry centered around real-world issues. Each student group has access to an adult mentor - parents ,teachers and friends of ROE - who make a commitment to them for one hour a week during the project time frame. While no special expertise is needed to be a mentor, some of our ROE community has knowledge and skills that would make working with a student group interesting and engaging for the mentor!

Mentors are asked to serve as a sounding board for student groups, challenging them to think deeper and looking for ways to support their research by connecting students with primary sources and possible action project ideas when possible. The role of the mentor is vital! Would you consider being an Exhibition mentor this year?

You do not have to have a 5th grader in order to be a mentor. In fact, parents that help when their students are younger gain great insight into what their own children have to look forward to down the road. All we ask is that mentors be VIPS approved, be willing to make a one-hour a week commitment to visit with their student group and have a love of learning alongside eager and motivated students! Meeting days and times are completely flexible within the school day, so it can work with most schedules! Mentoring begins the week of April 6th and runs through the week of May 11th.

It's that time of the year again! Girls Inc. is gearing up for another round of Camp SMART - complete with interactive science projects, fun and unique physical activities, and sessions on useful life skills. As always, we'll also focus on personal development each afternoon to allow the girls a chance to grow and learn outside of school, while still having fun.

Camp is for girls ages 12 -15 and will take place at Houston Baptist University from June 22 - July 10 (Monday through Friday only) from 8 am - 6 pm. We are accepting 30 applicants on a first come, first serve basis. The fee is \$150 per week (for a total of \$450), but financial assistance is available for those who qualify.

We have a lot of fun and interesting things lined up this year, and special events include:

- STEM-ulating science experiments with various science and math experts
- A visit and mini-clinic with players from the all-women's soccer team, the Houston Dash
 - Art classes
 - Creative writing classes
- Sessions on life skills girls will learn how to budget, change a flat tire, cook, remain safe in emergency situations, and more
- DIY projects, such as learning how to make your own shampoo and deodorant
- Lemonade Day- girls will learn how to run their own businesses and become entrepreneurs
