

FROM THE DESK OF DR. FOVARGUE

Dear HISD Supporter,

As you may know, HISD is subject to Recapture and must send local property tax dollars to the state of Texas. On May 6, voters will be asked HOW the district should pay its Recapture obligation. Recapture is one of the most important issues facing HISD, and the results of this upcoming ballot measure will affect our schools financially for years to come.

Here's the language that will appear on the ballot May 6, as required by the state:

Authorizing the board of trustees of Houston Independent School District to purchase attendance credits from the state with local tax revenues.

You might be asking yourself, "Didn't we already vote on this?" The answer is yes, but since that vote in November, significant progress has been made. Action by the Texas Education Agency reduced HISD's Recapture obligation from about \$162 million to about \$77.5 million. Future payments have been reduced, as well. This helps HISD. The previous vote also started a conversation among legislators in Austin about improving the state's school finance system. However, no additional funding has been approved. In response,

HISD's Board of Education called a new election on May 6, giving voters another opportunity to decide how HISD will pay its Recapture obligation now that the payments have been reduced.

A vote FOR purchasing attendance credits means HISD will pay its Recapture obligation by writing a check to the state comprised of local property taxes. It also means the district will continue to make annual recapture payments for the foreseeable future, but if our total tax collections continue to grow, then increased tax collections will help offset these payments. Taxes could increase under this scenario, as well. If tax collections cease to grow, the offset will be less.

A vote AGAINST purchasing attendance credits will result in detachment of the most valuable non-residential, commercial properties from the district's tax roll. The properties will be reassigned to other school districts for taxing purposes. Under current law, these properties will be permanently detached, and the district will permanently lose those tax collections for daily operations and schools. Importantly, the district will also lose debt service tax collections used to pay back bonds, which is debt used to build schools, most likely requiring a tax increase on residents and remaining businesses to pay the debt obligation. If detachment of property occurs, the district will have less capacity to fund schools.

Neither option is ideal for our school district. Ultimately, the Texas Legislature needs to reform school finance. However, we hope you educate yourself on the option you think is best for your household and your community. You can visit HoustonISD.org/Recapture to find more information about this issue, including an informational video. Please share this information with your community, and please vote on May 6. Early voting is April 24-May 2.
