4th and 5th Grade Electives

The Specialists and Support Staff are looking forward to a rewarding and enriching year! A highlight every school year is sponsoring the Wednesday Electives! The purpose of the program is to give 4th and 5th grade students the opportunity to explore an area of interest or talent.

Classes are from 8:00am-8:55am on Wednesday mornings.

We met with all 4th and 5th grade students on Wednesday, August 24th, highlighting the eleven enrichment classes being offered this year. On August 31st, students will complete a form circling three (3) choices of classes they find interesting. The forms will then be processed and students will be notified on Tuesday, September 6th of their class assignment. Electives will officially begin on Wednesday, September 7th.

Here is a description of the classes being offered:

The Agora at ROE - Mr. Mohammad: In ancient Greece, the "Agora" was a central gathering place where people came together to hear civic announcements or just talk about daily matters. In this elective, we'll practice different forms of speech and public speaking - from news delivery, to commercials, to persuasive speeches, to dramatic & comedic monologues! Focus will be on delivery techniques, mannerisms, memorization, and more. Come,

step out of your comfort zone and cure your "agora"phobia! Perfect for Exhibition and beyond!

Altered Books - Ms. Lieber: This year, students will recreate a book that was destined for a landfill into a work of art. As in past years, we will explore various media such as: pencils, markers, pen and ink, watercolor, and collage. Students should bring a "discarded" book that has no less than 100 pages and only with approval from parents. Hardback books make stronger altered books because of the bindings. This highly personalized book will be transformed over the course of this school year. Another project we will work on will be paintings on small cardboard canvases for sale or auction to raise money for Art at ROE.

Character Crew - Ms. Scholin: Are you a real character? Do you display character every day by living the IB Learner Profile? Students in this new elective will collaborate to build resources that will assist other students in understanding and developing strong character.

Exploring Poetry - Ms. Maillet: Are you a poet? Would you like to learn about writing poetry? This year in Exploring Poetry you will create your own working book of poems, submit poems to be published and most of all, have fun! Please join me on Wednesdays for this adventure!

Express Yourself - Ms. Ojore: Explore self-expression through various craft medium. Assignments will include hand-sewn quilt squares, weaving, t-shirt art, and small woodworking projects, utilizing recycled materials.

ROE Quavers - Ms. Stow: Do you sing in the shower or in front of the mirror with a hair brush? The ROE Quavers are looking for all those who love to sing and want to

develop their singing voices. The students will be enriched through a diverse repertoire from Disney to World Music, developing artistic interpretation. The choir students will improve skills of intonation, harmony and musical expression. The ROE Quavers will have several performance opportunities throughout the 2015-16 year, both on and off campus. Each student will be responsible for: learning lyrics, being enthusiastic and maintaining focus, listening well, having a good sense of pitch. Required choir uniform: Choir t-shirt (details to follow), black pants, and black shoes.

Serve Our School (SOS) - Dr. Fovargue: Service to ROE is what this elective is all about. Students on the SOS Team will partner with a classroom teacher or office staff member to lend a helping hand in whatever way is needed. Have you ever dreamed of being a teacher or working in a school? This will give you the opportunity to be an apprentice to some of the best teachers in Houston. SOS Team members need to be service oriented, dependable, flexible and willing to jump in and provide service to their school community. If these qualities describe you, then the SOS Team is your elective!

The Spanish Tales - Ms. Myers: Do you like to act out fairy tales and folk stories, or to create your own? The Spanish Tales is looking for Spanish language enthusiasts who love to act or create puppet shows using their acting voices and who want to develop their Spanish oral language skills. The students will be enriched through reading stories that can then be transformed into short plays, developing their Spanish communication skills and using their imagination to make simple presentations throughout the year.

Student Leadership Team - Ms. Goodman: When you think of the word leadership, what comes to mind? WHO comes to mind? What are the qualities that make a great

leader? That is what we will explore in this exciting elective class. Through discussions, presentations, videos and debates, we will explore leadership in our world and the role it plays within our student body. The Student Leadership Team will work to address concerns of the student body and participate in various leadership opportunities. This group will be the role model for the other students on campus and will seek to solve problems that face ROE students throughout the year. The Student Leadership Team will also be challenged to look for ways to take action outside of the school walls, to impact the community. If you are interested in making a difference in our school community and have a passion for helping others, then Student Leadership is for you!

Tame Your Brain - Ms. Lawrence: Students in the Mindfulness elective will embark on an exploration of themselves through a variety of practices and activities. Together, we will explore our brains and discover ways to strengthen and flex our mental muscles. By learning and practicing mindfulness, we will gain strategies to help us deal with anxiety, improve concentration, and handle difficult emotions. Practicing mindfulness will also increase our empathy for ourselves and others. Keep calm and be Mindful!!

Team Sports and Sports-Specific Training - Coach Bomersbach: Team Sports and Sports-Specific Training is designed to teach and instruct students on leadership skills, character building, and on the variety of roles team sports play in our society. The students will be learning and developing many aspects of team sports as well as learning sports-specific training methods to enhance their skills for a particular sport. Team Sports is a great platform for students to learn leadership skills and values that are associated with sports and life. We will be focusing on various sports such as Volleyball, Football,

Track Relays, Basketball, and different forms of Baseball/Softball.

How students will be placed in their elective class:

On Wednesday, August 31st, students will be given a ballot with all of the elective classes listed in alphabetical order. They will then be asked to circle their three (3) choices for an elective class. These choices WILL NOT be ranked as 1, 2, or 3; any classes circled should be classes that the student will enjoy. Students will receive their class assignments on Tuesday, September 6th, and they will participate in that elective for the entire school year.
