

up to seven high school graduation credits on our campus.

Nurse Canga offers these tips for nutritious eating habits:


- 1. Make Healthy Choices for Life

Promotion Standards

HISD administration just announced that Promotion Standards will remain the same for the current academic year, 2013-2014. For 6th, 7th, and 8th grades:

- 1. Students must pass STAAR exams in reading and math.
- 2. Students must have an overall yearly average of 70 or above and a local requirement of an average of 70 or above in three of the four core courses:
 - Language arts (average of reading and English),
 - mathematics,
 - science, and
 - social studies.
