Two HISD Educators Named 'Champions of Change' by White House

August 31, 2012 - Two HISD educators were honored Friday at the White House as **"Champions of Change"** for their efforts to improve the lives of Hispanic youths.

Teacher Development Specialist **Ben Hernandez** and Austin High School teacher **Armando Orduña** were nominated by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, which also handpicked them to be members of that organization's inaugural Teacher Advisory Council earlier this year.

At Austin High School, students and staff members gathered in two classrooms to watch the live feed of the White House awards ceremony, which highlighted all of the recipients. Principal Jorge Arredondo said he was proud of Orduña's achievement. "(It's) an honor and something we should appreciate and continue to support—the advancement of teachers across the United States," Arredondo said. "We want to be at the forefront of change and good practices, and so it's important to have our very own teachers who are leading here in Houston and being recognized at the national level."

Hernandez said retaining effective teachers requires a focused approach concentrating on three areas: redefining success, restructuring compensation to compete with the private sector, and developing career pathways, which is something HISD is committed to.

"(HISD is) very progressive and aggressive, so I think in a lot of ways, it can turn national eyes on us to see what we're doing right." Hernandez said.

Our plans for this tribute go all the way back to 2010, when Moses Villapando, the chairman of the 75th Anniversary, suggested that the Scottish Brigade should have a tribute in a prominent place at AHS. Upon Alumnae Association Board approval of the proposed plaque, a mockup was available, details were announced at the 2011 Luncheon, funds were raised, and plans proceeded.



This all culminated in the disclosure of the beautiful green marble plaque with skin frost lettering in the front foyer of AHS honoring our beloved Scottish Brigade and its founder and sponsors. It began with a stirring rendition of our familiar drum and bugle sounds along with photos of the Armistice Day Parade in 1937, marking the inaugural performance of the Scottish Brigade. As Chairman, I was honored to speak of the early times, the demise in 1978, and memories of B. Lytle, Betty Blakely, and Parthenia Papuga. These inspiring ladies led us for forty years as we became the pulse beat of AHS until the organization was retired, and we became part of the history of Houston.

Members of the first and last Brigade were represented by Bonnie Damon Torrey '39 and Ida Beth Geschke '78, when one lone voice began singing "The Bagpipe Corps Slow Song," followed by other voices throughout the auditorium as the Tribute was revealed on the screen. Needless to say, there was not a dry eye in the room as a bagpiper playing "Scotland the Brave" marched down the aisle.

I hope you will stop by to take a look at the Tribute -- it will remind former students, current students, and future students – just like it says in our song – of the "lively step of the bagpipes" hum leaving a memory that will not fade of Austin High and the Scottish Brigade." *continued at bottom of next page*

After finally getting over our shyness, we then broke our silence and started asking each other questions while we walked to the cafeteria where we, for my luck, found out we had no classes together. That didn't matter as much though, because we still managed to plan our reunion for lunch so we could sit together which worked perfectly. Gladly, this went on for pretty much the whole year and every day we would meet up in the same place and walk together to our classes and lunch.

Meanwhile, sooner than I had expected, I was already meeting many new people. I also started joining clubs and sports. I would always stay before or after school whether for practice, meetings, or tutorials. It was then that I realized how fast time was going. My freshman year was now over, and later, my sophomore and junior year ended too soon.

Every day I walk into Austin High School, I know that I'm closer to accomplishing my dreams of being a writer. I have met so many good teachers who have helped me through so many challenges, and some whom I consider as family. It has made me a responsible young adult who knows what to expect and how to accomplish goals. It has also shown me how competition is not always negative, but instead, can be conceptualized as fighting for what you want. I'm no longer that teenage girl who thought high school was purely a social experience or just appearing in class, with not a care of whether I understood the lesson or not. I know that if I ever have trouble with something, all I have to do is speak up and not be afraid of expressing myself. I am now that young adult who, through hard work, will get what and where she wants.

Before her appointment, Justice Guzman served as an Associate Justice on the Houston-based Texas Fourteenth Court of Appeals for eight years and as a trial court judge on the 309th Family District Court, having been appointed to the 309th by Gov. George W. Bush in 1999. Justice Guzman brings broad based experienced to the bench, having ruled on thousands of cases and published hundreds of opinions. As a hard-working judge on one of our state's busiest courts, Justice Guzman has consistently received high marks in judicial-evaluation polls. She has been recognized by many law and community organizations for her service on and off the bench. Most recently, she was awarded the Hispanic Women's Network of Texas 2012 Latina Trailblazer award and the Texas Women Lawyer's 2012 Pathfinder award. She has previously been named one of the "101 Most Influential Latino Leaders" by Latino Leaders magazine, a national publication. In 2009, the Hispanic National Bar Association honored Justice Guzman as "Latina Judge of the Year." The Mexican American Bar Association of Texas Foundation also has recognized Justice Guzman for her many contributions and awarded her its "2009 Judge of the Year award." Two local law-enforcement organizations, P.O.L.I.C.E., Inc. and Houston Police Officers Union, have selected Justice Guzman as "Appellate Judge of the Year" in prior years. In 2006, Texas Executive Women presented Justice Guzman on the Move" award in recognition of her professional and civic accomplishments.

A Senior Fellow of the American Leadership Forum, Justice Guzman has a long track record of community service and has devoted many volunteer hours to organizations committed to children. In June 2010, she was named Chair of the Supreme Court of Texas Permanent Commission on Children's Youth and families She has previously served on the boards of Texas Court Appointed Special Advocates, The Escape Center, Wesley Community Center, and The Chinquapin School, and the Advisory Council of The Salvation Army Boys and Girls Clubs of Metropolitan Houston and the Greater Houston Area Chapter of the American Red Cross. Before taking the bench, Justice Guzman enjoyed a successful 10-year career in private law practice. She holds a B.B.A. from the University of Houston and a law degree from South Texas College of Law and is currently completing course work on an LLM in Judicial Studies at Duke University School of Law. Though born in Chicago, Justice Guzman grew up in Houston and has been a resident for more than 35 years. She and her husband, Houston Police Sergeant Tony Guzman, have one daughter, Melanie Alexis who is a junior at Harvard University.

### To Be or not to be, An Aggie or a Longhorn?



It is 6:15 AM, September 28, 2012 and guite dark at 1700 Dumble. Two Coach buses are pulled up in front of S.F. Austin High School ready to make the drive to Texas A&M University College Station, Texas. Fifty nine 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students, dressed for success, board the buses this early morning and get ready to explore and walk the campus learning about the Aggies and their school. The students are excited about their next step into college and although Texas A&M seems to be a long way from the East End and their familiar neighborhood it is at least a possibility for the Class of 2013 and 2014. They come to Kyle Field, the academic quad and the newly renovated Memorial Student Center with eyes wide opened and an awareness that may be they can leave home and attend here. Our day is packed with tours of the Education department,

the Nuclear Reactor and the Mechanical Engineering department- some have to make a hard choices of where to tour. One of the highlights of the day is the lunch at SBISA, a huge dining hall with Austin High School students from 2009-2012 graduating classes. In this hour long lunch our students get to ask questions from their peers of what college is really like and how can they get in and stay there. They all get back on the bus at 4:30 PM still excited with questions answered and raised about their future college.

The same scenario is repeated but with another forty-eight students on October 3, 2012 but this time at 5:45 AM for a 6:00 AM departure to the University of Texas at Austin. Again students are exposed to UT and given the opportunity this time to attend briefly a class of chemistry. Our students are surprised to see the Chemistry class packed out with some students sitting in the aisles. They tour the engineering department and see a working wind tunnel and the college of communications where they learn about working in broadcasting or journalism. Again it is a full day and once again they get to see their peers there working towards a degree from UT. This gives them reasons to hope

they can be in that place some day. Our day ends with a presentation with an excellent UT college admissions counselor who speaks frankly about the challenges he has overcome as a UT grad and what it takes to be a Longhorn in the Fall of 2013. Getting back on the bus at 5:00 PM we arrive back at SFA tired but encouraged that college away from home as far as Austin, Texas could work for many of them.

A special thanks to the S.F. Austin Alumni Association for their support in funding the buses and to Mr. William Stickney, Austin High College Counselor for assisting and coordinating these college visits. Also thanks to Principal Jorge Arredondo for allowing our students to miss a day of school for this very worthwhile purpose.
