#### HELLO FALL-MESSAGE FROM MRS. ROZAS

It may not feel like it, but Fall is upon us. The official first day of Fall in the US is September 23 but I always feel like it is beginning when school gets going and we start to see those holiday displays in the stores.

I know that the beginning of school can be exciting, emotional and even difficult at times. Our dismissal took longer than we anticipated but we are monitoring closely and the lines are finishing closer to last year. I am confident that as we tighten our procedures, the process will improve. I have been asking random cars how long they have been waiting and they have not said longer than 10 minutes. We begin dismissing at 3:00 unless it is raining heavily and then we will start dismissing between 2:30 and 2:45.

As a campus, there really is **nothing** we can ignore when thinking about our children's education-everything is important! That being said, **Attendance** and **literacy** are two things you will hear a lot about this year-and probably every year we are together. These two topics <u>will determine the future of your child</u>. When I say future, I mean middle school, high school, college and career.

I have shared on many occasions the story Dr. Grier our Superintendent shares almost every time I hear him speak. It is about two groups of students in first grade. One group was consistently early to school, the second group was consistently late or absent. Researchers followed these students for several years and found that the group who showed consistent and prompt attendance were all reading on or above grade level. Those who were chronically late and frequently absent were at least <u>two grade levels behind</u>. I am going to assume which you want for your child. Although class begins at 7:45, we open our doors at 7:00 and we have staff ready to welcome students. I would encourage you to try and arrive as close to 7:00 as you can. If you have to drop off to multiple locations, come here first as the middle schools and high schools open later. It may seem like a minor issue but it pays off big over the course of a child's school career.

Literacy-I could go on for years. What is most important? That your child loves to

read and sees reading as something pleasurable to do. When we think about reading, think about books, magazines and even reading on the internet. If it involves words and ideas, it is reading! Think about your literacy too. Do your children see you reading? Reading magazines, recipes, newspapers or online information, it is all reading and modeling the love and need for reading is an important support you can give your child.

# PTO

The presentation focused on the idea that everyone can participate in supporting parents through PTO no matter what their time constraints.

## ASSESSMENT

Did you know that the word assess comes from Latin roots which mean to sit beside or assist in the office of a judge? Knowing that our students are growing each year and reaching their highest potential is what most parents want when thinking about school results.

Did you also know in Texas, we assess in many different ways? Here is a short list:

National tests: Stanford is a national test. It compares your child's results to the results of other children in the US to give you and idea of how they perform compared to children of the same age. This test is administered K-5 in HISD.

State tests: The STAAR test is a state test administer to students in grades 3-5. This is an achievement test that should indicate whether a child has all of the knowledge and skills for the grade level test they are taking. The STAAR is a little bit different from the TAKS test which came before it as it asks students to not only know the content but to be able to apply it in multiple ways. STAAR is a test of thinking.

Local tests: The Houston Independent School District has many assessments that are given throughout the year for many purposes. We are currently administering the beginning of the year assessments and Istation online assessments.

Campus based: We use the observational survey and the developmental reading assessment (DRA) Pre-K-2 to pinpoint students reading level so that we can personalize reading instruction. Teachers also administer assessments in their class as needed to inform their planning.
