
In November, Mr. Waddell is included in the exhibit celebrating ten years of the Lawndale Art Center's residency program.

First of all, the Creative Writing Department has just learned that Fareena Arefeen, Class of 2018, has been named the second Houston Youth Poet Laureate! We are so excited for Fareena and can't wait to see what kinds of programs she develops for the students around Houston.

The Creative Writing Department returned from its fifth annual trip to the Texas Book Festival inspired. This year, 65 students began the three-day field trip to Austin at the Harry Ransom Center where they read through the archives of writers including David Foster Wallace and T.S. Eliot. They then spent two days attending panels and learning about craft from writers such as T.C. Boyle, Lois Lowry, and Don Delillo. Now that we're back, the focus is on our middle school workshop. Seniors and juniors are planning and rehearsing their lessons while the freshmen and sophomores will serve as group leaders on the day of the event. Lastly, our Fall/Off the Page was held on December 2 where our writers present work in a multitude of formats including spoken word, short films, and readings.

Humanities Department


Last year HSPVA was fortunate enough to add Advanced Placement Psychology to our course offerings. Students have been asking for this class for some time, so it has been a popular elective class as we move in to the second year of AP Psych! Last year 88% of HSPVA Psychology students passed the national exam compared to the national average of 64%. We plan to improve on that in our second year to see more and more students earn college credit.

The PTO has been generous in its support of this offering by assisting students who are unable to afford the expensive text.

This fall students have explored the learning concept of operant conditioning (remember B.F. Skinner?) culminating

with a critical discussion of how fear and race become linked in our society through conditioning in the media and by other means. Violence and fear are naturally linked, but socialization changes the formula to violence + race = fear. Students shared stories from their own lives about how both blatant and subtle acts of racism have affected their own lives. The discussion then explored how these same processes apply to sexism, heterosexism, classism, ageism, and more. Finally, this thoughtful discussion ended with ideas about ways we can interrupt that divisive conditioning.

This is the power of teaching psychology at HSPVA; these future artists and leaders can gain the vocabulary and understanding to talk about, and do something about, issues of real importance in the world.



PTO SCHOOL STORE

The HSPVA School Store has been up and running in its new location on the second floor since August 2015. The kids all know where it is as told by the over
