

Houston Independent School District's Energy & Sustainability team is hosting Earth Month 2018 to raise awareness about the environmental impact of our campuses and promote sustainable behaviors that reduce our "footprint" and save money!

HOW DO SCHOOLS ENROLL?

Select your school's Earth Month Champion, a leader in your school who is taking a stand for sustainability, and submit the Earth Month Pledge. By acting during April, your school will be helping the district and the earth. Pledges can be submitted beginning April 2.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

After schools sign up, they can begin engaging in select activities to help the environment and earn points. Events are worth varying amounts of points based on the level of effort involved. Be sure to track your points, because the campus with the most participation points wins Earth Month 2018!

WHAT DO I WIN?

The winning campus is eligible to win a sustainable outdoor classroom and accompanying curriculum based on grade level:

- K-5: Learn, Grow, Eat & Go!
- 6-12: <u>Junior Master Gardener</u>

HOW DO WE WIN?

As you complete the Earth Month activities of your choice, be sure to track and record completion through photos and written documentation. The campus with the most points wins Earth Month 2018 and a sustainable outdoor classroom with accompanying curriculum! At the end of the month, submit your checklist of completed activities signed by your school principal to Sustainability@HoustonISD.org.

What Earth Day Means to Me Student Writing or Drawing Assignment Talk to your class about what Earth Day means to them. Have them to write a short paragraph or draw a picture expressing their thoughts and creativity. Enjoy the student's work by hanging picture and essays in the hallways throughout Earth Month.	15/person
The Great Earth Day Book Exchange Encourage student to bring one (or more) book(s) to class on a designated day to exchange with their classmates (reuse!). Request good, gently used books (not freebies) that are of the respective grade level of the students.	10/person
Eco-FriendlyAnnouncements	
Include eco-friendly tips during the daily PA announcements. Prior to, and during Earth Month. Teachers can encourage their students to research and document interesting eco-facts to share with the school (e.g., facts on recycling, conservation, wildlife habitats, pollution prevention, etc.). These can be read during the morning and afternoon announcements through the month of April to remind students of their connection to the planet and the importance of protecting it for themselves and future generations.	5/day
