School Wide-Parent Compact for Title I, Part A Effective for 2017-2018

Pershing Middle School and the parents of the students participating in activities, services, and programs funded by Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) (participating children), agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

Pershing Middle School will:

- Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:
 - Students have access to technology to enhance instruction (We have 11 Computer Carts on Wheels that house laptops utilized during instruction. We have two levels of instruction for the purpose of allowing each student to receive the necessary rigor: Pre-AP and Core. Houston Independent School District has provided all core classes with a library to promote literacy. Teachers participate in "Professional Learning Communities" weekly to learn best practices that can be implemented in the classroom. We have A+ Organization conducting workshops for effectively teacher reading and holding reading conference; we also have A+ creating common assessments for our Math department all grade levels. In addition, we have Mark Spillman providing mentorship to our 7th grade writing teachers.
- Hold parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement.
 - -Parent Teacher conferences are held weekly as needed during teachers' conference/planning time. (this time varies by department)
- Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.
 - -Parents will receive report cards from their student on the district mandated dates: 10-13-2017, 11/17/2017, 1/12/2017, 2/23/2017, 4/13/2017 and 6/1/2018. Parents will also have access to teacher websites and the district online grading system (grade speed) which shows students grades in "real time."
- **Provide parents reasonable access to staff.** Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows: Staff will be available twice a week during their specific conference time to speak with parents.
- Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

We have an open-door policy that allows parents to visit classrooms on request.

Parent Responsibilities: We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

- Monitoring attendance.
- Making sure that homework is completed.
- Volunteering in my child's classroom.
- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my children's education.
- Promoting positive use of my child's extracurricular time.
- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school

OPTIONAL ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

We, as students, will share the responsibility to improve our academic achievement and achieve the State's high standards. Specifically, we will:

- Do my homework every day and ask for help when I need to.
- Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.
- Give to my parents or the adult who is responsible for my welfare all notices and information received by me from my school every day.

Pershing Middle School will:

- Involve parents in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's parental involvement policy, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way.
- Involve parents in the joint development of any school wide program plan, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way.

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- Hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements, and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a convenient time to parents, and will offer a flexible number of additional parental involvement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend.
