K-12 READING & MATHEMATICS UNIVERSAL SCREENER REPORTS UPDATES AND FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ'S)

1. What is the process for accessing Universal Screener data reports?

Below are steps on how to access Universal Screen reports. It is recommended that you start with the Screening Report. This report will group students based on how they performed and in four categories based on percentile ranks.

Above 40^{th} percentile \rightarrow Above benchmark

Between 25 – 39th percentile \rightarrow On Watch

Below the 25th percentile \rightarrow Intervention

Below the 10^{th} percentile \rightarrow Urgent intervention

From the Home screen click on the product for which you want to run reports. Select **Reports** from the menu.

In addition to the Screening Report, the Instructional Planning Report and the Diagnostic Report also provide valuable information.

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2. What is the process to access Universal Screener data reports for Spanish?

Star Spanish reporting capabilities are currently available via the Reading Dashboard and the Math Dashboard tiles located on your Home page, depending on which Star Spanish test you have administered. After selecting the Reading or Math Dashboard, to see your students':

- domain scores select the Monitor Student Mastery dashboard
- Star Unified Scaled Scores select the View Assessment Data dashboard

Home Page > Reading OR Math Dashboard > Monitor Student Mastery (domain scores) OR View Assessment Data (unified scaled scores)

3. What student information does the Spanish data reports provide?

The Star Spanish programs provide a Scaled Score and Domain Scores.

A student's Scaled Score is calculated based upon the difficulty of the questions and the number of correct responses. You can view Scaled Scores for your students on the View Assessment Data dashboard view/report, which is accessed through your Reading Dashboard and/or Math Dashboard, depending on the assessment taken. Star Spanish scores are expressed using the Star Unified Scale, which has a range of 0–1400. The Spanish programs use the Unified Scale; however, the Star Spanish Scaled Scores do not span its entire range:

- Star Early Literacy Spanish SS range: 200-1100
- Star Math Spanish SS range: 600-1400
- Star Reading Spanish SS range: 600-1400

Domain Scores measure the student's degree of mastery of grade-level skills in a domain (in cases where the items are presented in Spanish). Domain Scores range from 0-100. Note that Domain Scores do not reflect any specific items students answered correctly or incorrectly while taking a Star assessment, but instead are derived from the student's overall Star Unified Scaled Score. By focusing on a specific domain for instruction, students learn more skills which should raise the overall Star Unified Scaled Score and improve Domain Scores in all domains. You can view Domain Scores for your students on the Monitor Student Mastery dashboard view/report, accessed through your Reading Dashboard and/or Math Dashboard, depending on the assessment taken.

4. Why are the data reports for students taking the English assessments different from students taking the Spanish assessments.?

Currently, Renaissance Spanish data reports are not aligned to the English data reports. Renaissance is continuing to refine their Spanish products and they anticipate a major improvement and alignment of the Spanish products by January.

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5. How can I check to see if all students have completed the Universal Screener assessments?

Schools can run a report called the Test Activity report.

For each of the products they simply click on the assessment tile, from the menu select **Reports**. Once they get to the Select Report screen the Test Activity Report is at the bottom of the menu.
