Middle School Forum for 5th Grade Parents: Wednesday, October 29, 2014 at 6:30 PM

Each school will talk about their magnet programs, extracurricular clubs, sports, curriculum and the application process before we go into a Q&A session.







Hands on Art

Last week the students had their October Hands on Art lesson.

Kindergarten thru Second Grade

Kindergarten thru Second grade classes studied American artist Charley Harper and minimal realism. Harper used bright colors and basic geometric shapes to create his famous images of birds and fish. He used lines to create a sense of perspective and motion. The children made Harper-inspired fish for their Original Works creations using oil pastel and watercolors.

You should have received your child's artwork last week along with an order form from **Original Works.** Parents can order mugs, notecards...featuring their child's artwork. A portion of proceeds will be used to cover Hands on Art costs. Order forms can be returned to your child's teacher or placed in the "Hands on Art" box in the Front Office. **Deadline to order is November 6th.**

Third thru Fifth Grade

The Third thru Fifth grade classes learned about the **Spanish architect, Antoni Gaudí.** Lesson Highlights included:

- Discussion of Gaudí's use of nature in his architecture (shells, forests, snakes...)
- Overview of mosaic art
- Review of Gaudi's more famous works including a park, a church and several houses.

The students created their own mosaics inspired by a Gaudí's mosaic lizard found in Park Guell. To create his mosaics, Gaudí used pieces of old ceramic plates and cups...he was a recycler ahead of his time. The students' mosaics were made using expired paint chips donated by a local business. Like Gaudí's mosaics, the children's mosaics involved reusing materials to create a work of art. On November 1st, the West U Recycling & Solid Waste Reduction Board, Bellaire Environmental & Sustainability Board and Bellaire Cultural Arts Board are hosting *Recycles Fest* which includes a recycled art contest. The students can enter the mosaic project they created using expired/unused paint chips. Additional information about the contest can be found at. www.ci.bellaire.tx.us.
