

Principal's Place

Did you, your parents, grandparents, or neighbors attend West U Elementary School or Pershing Junior High School (when it was housed on our campus)? We are collecting stories from people who went to school here. As you may know, West U Elementary opened in 1925 with just six rooms (100-103 and 201-202, a small upstairs auditorium (now rooms 901 and 904), and two offices. This is the front part of our building closest to the corner of University and Edloe. Either Mr. Connelly's office or the faculty lounge across the hall was the original principal's office.

In 1927, John J. Pershing Junior High School opened with eight classrooms plus a kindergarten room that had its own entrance, and office space. The original Pershing is now our office complex, rooms 110-113 and 210-213, and what is now our Clinic (this was originally a classroom). Pershing moved to its current location in 1948.
