We still need your help with parking in faculty spaces, using faculty parking lot and Goode Street for drop-off, and parking in handicapped spaces without a permit. We're experiencing many situations where parents or nannies ignore our parking regulations. Please help us with this situation. Just to clarify, the parking spaces in front of the school, behind the school near the T-buildings, in the west parking lot next to Bullard Field, and in one-third of the west parking spaces in front of the ball fields on University are reserved for faculty and staff (these areas are marked with signs). PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THESE AREAS. Teachers cannot get to work on time if they must circle the block looking for a parking place.

During afternoon pick-up, please do not park in the HISD bus loading area (between our marquee and our parking lot entrance). If you park in the head-in parking in front of the ball fields, you may be blocked in by the private daycare buses for a few minutes. They are not permitted to back up due to the danger to pedestrians.

Goode Street may not be used for student drop-off or pick up.

We've had a few issues with parents picking up children enroute to their after-school care bus, or have made plans for their child to go home with another student or parent without informing the office and the afterschool care provider. If your afterschool pick-up plans change from what you normally do each day, please let us know. Many days we spend time looking for children, trying to call parents, etc. only to find the parents changed their plans without telling us.
