
from Westside High School

Social Studies teacher, Ms. Shelby Steward, set up a Go Fund Me campaign and raised money to go towards uniforms and supplies for our Wolves. Westside Cadets Serve Their Neighbors During Harvey

On August 25, 2017 Houston experienced record breaking rainfall due to Hurricane Harvey. The rain caused severe flooding in Houston and surrounding areas. Combined rescue efforts by first responders, military, federal and local units, as well as civilians, were launched to help evacuate people from their flooded homes. Westside High School 10th grade student and JROTC Cadet Corporal Theotim Jones, along with 11th grade student Cadet Corporal Vincent Doan, participated in this massive rescue effort.

On August 28, the Briarhills subdivision, which is just north of Westside High School and home to our two cadets, was one of the many neighborhoods that flooded. Fortunately for both cadets, their homes were spared from the deluge of water that was released from the Barker Cypress Reservoir. However, when they realized that some of their neighbors were not as fortunate, they acted with haste and took part in the effort to help out people who were stranded in their homes. Cadet Jones instantly became aware that his neighbors may need help and he secured kay-

aks from friends. Cadet Doan, who lived a couple of houses away, saw Cadet Jones and immediately joined him in the rescue efforts. Both cadets waded through waist deep water as they went from house to house checking on people that needed assistance or evacuation. They continued relentlessly for three days working their way from one house to another, checking on people needing assistance. They also helped in passing out water to people who were stranded in their homes. They evacuated a total of 20 people and their pets from flooded homes.

New Initiative: Literacy Empowered!

Last week, Westside received thousands of new books as part of HISD’s *Literacy Empowered* initiative. The books are now available for checkout from classroom libraries in all English Language Arts and Social Studies classes. The focus will be on independent reading, writing, and thinking critically.

Parents are encouraged to support their students at home by ensuring 30 minutes of independent reading per day, including assigned reading, reading for pleasure, and reading magazines and online articles. Remember, their Westside IDs grant them access to Houston Public Libraries. Coming soon, students will be tracking their reading time in a WHS Reading Log. Students are also encouraged to take advantage of their access to Khan Academy for

personalized tutorials in many subjects and SAT Preparation. Westside’s literacy goals include daily reading in and outside of the classroom, daily writing in all core classes, and additional writing on all major assessments.
