Overview

Luby's, Inc. (Luby's), a restaurant chain with over 128 locations throughout Texas and four other states, has been a longtime supporter of Houston Independent School District and its initiatives. Each year Luby's provides lunches for the more than 1400 volunteers who participate in the district's annual Reach Out to Dropouts Walk.
