FACTS AND FIGURES

2014 - 2015 DEMOGRAPHICS

The Houston Independent School District, with more than 215,000 students and encompassing 301 square miles within greater Houston, is the seventh-largest public school system in the nation and the largest in Texas. Five chief schools officers oversee HISD elementary, middle, high and alternative/charter schools (respectively). A total of 26 school-support officers and 12 lead principals report to the five chiefs. These individuals provide leadership to principals, align resources and support for teachers, and ensure that the district is providing equitable and quality educational opportunities to students. Parent liaisons are available to answer questions and address matters regarding district schools.

HISD's organization is designed to emphasize teaching and learning, align school goals and programs for sustained improvement, eliminate duplicated services, and provide greater oversight of data and compliance with state laws and regulations.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

The State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness, or STAAR, is the state testing program that was implemented in the 2011-12 school year to replace the previous Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) testing program. The STAAR program includes annual assessments for:

- Reading and mathematics, grades 3-8
- Writing at grades 4 and 7
- Science at grades 5 and 8
- · Social studies at grade 8
- End-of-course assessments for English I, English II, Algebra I, Biology and U.S History.
