HISD has the lowest property tax rate of the 20-plus school districts in Harris County.

HISD has the highest credit rating, AAA, from Moody's rating service, and is rated AA+ by Standard and Poor's.

Facilities Services is responsible for the maintenance of 280 open schools and other sites with approximately 30 million square feet of building space.

Transportation Services uses 800 buses to transport approximately 36,000 students each day, traveling about 86,000 miles per day.

FACTS AND FIGURES

2018-2019 DEMOGRAPHICS

The Houston Independent School District, with more than 210,061 students and encompassing 333 square miles within greater Houston, is the seventh-largest public-school system in the nation and the largest in Texas. Six area superintendents oversee HISD elementary, middle, high and alternative/charter schools (respectively). A total of 24 school-support officers report to the six area superintendents. These individuals provide leadership to principals, align resources and support for teachers, and ensure that the district is providing equitable and quality educational opportunities to students. Parent liaisons are available to answer questions and address matters regarding district schools.

HISD's organization is designed to emphasize teaching and learning, align school goals and programs for sustained improvement, eliminate duplicated services, and provide greater oversight of data and compliance with state laws and regulations.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

The State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness, or STAAR, is the state testing program that was implemented in the 2011-12 school year to replace the previous Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) testing program. The STAAR program includes annual assessments for:

- Reading and mathematics, grades 3–8
- · Writing at grades 4 and 7
- Science at grades 5 and 8
- Social studies at grade 8
- End-of-course assessments for Algebra I, Biology, English I, English II, and U.S History.y

The HISD Police Department employs 215 officers and responds to about 46,618 calls per year.

Nutrition Services has 1,800 employees who serve more than 250,000 breakfast, lunch, and dinner meals to students at no cost each day.

\$481.1 million in scholarships were offered to HISD seniors who graduated in 2019.

The number of students who took the SAT increased by 117 percent from 4,703 in 2007 to 10,183 in 2019.
