1. Mr. Issa Dadoush called the meeting to order @ 8:34 a.m. After the welcome, he allowed round table introductions of each attendee. He conveyed to the committee that he would provide an executive summary on the status of construction projects over the past quarter. The meeting took place at Lora Peck Elementary School and Mr. Dadoush offered to do a tour of the new school after the meeting.

2. Meeting Minutes from January 17, 2012:

A draft of the previous meeting minutes was reviewed. With no changes or corrections, a motion was made and seconded to approve minutes as presented.

3. Executive Summary

Mr. Dadoush presented an Executive Summary, outlining the transformation of schools throughout the city due to the \$805 million bond proposal that voters approved in 2007. Mr. Dadoush stated that this Executive summary would be different from the last meeting as he was looking for "history" regarding the bond program and the fact that litigation had impacted the progress for moving forward. Money was not available for the past several years and we have actually had full funding for the first time and Ms. Redricks and Ms. Savoie Litigation actually delayed the construction in the could confirm same. beginning and now that it's been resolved we have been able to move forward. We are currently in Phase 3. The projects now under construction will be completed during summer. The promises that were made for 2007 have been honored fully. The summary included expansions, safety and security upgrades, and new schools to replace aging facilities. Security has been made the top priority for students and, teachers alike. We have added new fencing and will be adding additional fencing for more schools. More than 700 cameras have been installed with an actual count to date being 12,100 active cameras. Is it enough? No. It was also noted that 2,000 cameras were installed in 2008. Two schools are currently under construction, two more schools are in the planning phase and we are in constant communication with HCC in reference to the construction of such. We have had 50 more schools that have undergone renovations. We are exceeding expectations since the 2007 Bond commitment. Everything in reference to our commitment is ultimately right on target. This concludes the Executive Summary.

4. Financial Report

The Financial Report was presented next. Ms. Kathi Redrick discussed the current overall financial status report for the 2007 Facilities Capital Program. We have all of funding resources that total \$1,176,000.00 at our disposal. We have a total of unspent funding at \$398 billion; we have actual \$545 million now; with \$145 million unspent. Per Mr. Dadoush, up to March 31, 2012 we are currently on budget. We are also fully funded for Group 4.

Business Assistance/ Finance

5. Supplemental Program Information

Ms. Tonya Savoie presented the schedule of projects, commitments, budget reports and detailed contingency reports. We have funding from external sources approved by TRS.

6. Progress Update Report

Next, Construction and Facility Services presented an update on the status of projects in the Facilities Capital Program. Mr. Bankhead provided a summary of the Traffic Light Report.

Mr. Bankhead addressed current projects stating that the Bond Program is

moving very rapidly and we are getting a lot done. We have completed over 60 projects to date. We currently have roughly about 47-48 projects under construction and we have about 12 contracts right now being circulated for the start of construction. This is going to be one of the busiest summers in the entire Bond Program. I'm scared to even estimate how many projects we will have under construction at that time. We are able to do the facilities that were constructed under the 2007 program. Many of our facilities have received recognition and that's the best way to say it. We have given our architects and our project teams flexibility and they have risen to the occasion; risen to the challenge to build. I just want you to know that on one of the projects in the early part of the program we received the 2011 Award of Value from the Texas Association of School Board Administrators for Peck Elementary and they have also won the Bellfort 2012 Childhood Award for their work in renovation and restoration; another Houston design award for which Issa and I attended the ceremony this past weekend; and the Crockett school was recognized in the "Learning By Design" magazine for their engineering and design scope in 2012. We are not just fixing things and patching and repairing, we are actually going a step beyond the design. We are building stellar facilities with lower costs. We are doing safety security sweeps and reallocating funds where possible.

We are trying to go a bit above and beyond; we are replacing windows in some of the facilities that are leaking. We are also bringing high performance in our buildings, like windows that are energy efficient where they not only keep out the light and heat but with low coatings to maintain high performance enhancements to help minimize the noise in the classrooms. They are quality windows so that teachers won't have to be screaming in order that all the students can hear her all the way to the back of the room. So we are not just fixing but using quality fixtures to improve performance.

We are proud of the costs we are keeping down per square foot and we are lower than many other school districts across the country. But we are still adding/increasing value to the communities that will also increase property values just with the improvement of the schools alone. We are roughly \$120-\$160 per sq ft.

Direction to the Traffic Light Report. Many green lights; the yellow lights are those with some changes and need for improvement or glitches that need attention.

Also, we are trying to see how we can allocate funds towards other uses/needs in other areas of the district in other schools as needed for safety and security.

Yellow for us means that there is something about this project that needs monitoring from us; maybe budget issues or schedule issues. So we pay a little extra attention to these.

A lot of green for a lot of projects completed or finished. Attention was given to some details on the yellow light projects. However, these projects will be completed in 2012. Some of these projects have been delayed or hampered due to weather conditions but we are getting back on track. For example:

<u>Alcott ES</u> – additional work done to replace the glazing; all glass window systems to be replaced extending project schedule.

<u>Atherton</u> - severe weather impact; architectural team discord between contractors impacted schedule time lines – CFS stepped in to assess the situation; hashed it out and we will finish project timely.

<u>Stadium project</u> – due to some code requirements from the City Health Department we had additional scope and also additional funding was needed. So we did some investigating to see just what the best way is to handle this project. It's taking a little longer affecting project schedule. But we will get it done.

<u>Browning-Harvard-Hamilton</u> – it is best to rebid this one and we are moving forward.

Kenneth English with AECOM explains: We had some bids in this particular case – some of the bid documents were incomplete and confusing and we had 4 of the 8 initial proposals – **our** recommendation was to re-bid it as some of the edits weren't clear as they needed to be.

It was decided that every 6 months or so; all those involved would evaluate selection of Group 4 to ensure that everything on a project was on schedule and as planned and designed

Discussion: Mr. Flores asked how contractors are picked for jobs from bids.

Mr. Tran wanted to revisit the construction/layout of the driveway for Beck ES; said he felt it was too small for visitors and not enough parking spaces; also, water sitting on lot and needed better drainage.

Mr. Bankhead stated that would be researched and dealt with.

Burris ES - design phase impacted schedule.

<u>Vanguard</u> – severe weather impacted schedule timeline – this has been revisited and has gotten better and looking to complete timely.

<u>Carrillo</u> - additional work from result of trust allocation which slowed down the project.

Davis HS – additional electrical/mechanical work causing delays.

<u>Eastwood Academy</u> – on its way to schedule recovery. Additional work as it needed roofing; hard bids; identify funding with a large necessity to address.

<u>Hamilton/Jr. Harris</u> – trustee allocation; delayed construction to allow additional work project.

Mr. Dadoush reported that the permitting delay process has been improved. Design teams are completed in a timely manner. CFS and the City of Houston have strengthened their relationships. As a result, the City of Houston is accommodating HISD projects.

Mr. Tran added that most families entering or moving to a new community, the first **thing** they look for is a good school for their children. When you have a high performance, good-looking school it makes it more desirable to live in that community and it also increases the value of the community as a whole.

7. Business Assistance (M/WBE) Report

Ms. Licata discussed how to do business with HISD, events and outreach programs that have taken place since the October 2011 committee meeting. The M/WBE participation regarding A/E projects are up 3%. Charts were included in the presentation to reflect M/WBE participation for CSP Contractors Projects, CMAR projects, CMPA Projects and the Total Combined Projects. Monthly tracking reports to ensure licensures are renewed every two years with the City of Houston.

Mr. Tran requested an explanation of how others in the ethnic communities, in particular, the Vietnamese community could get access to current on-going events for the small business communities. Ms. Licata explained the use of the HISD website in order to view and get a better understanding of business events that would be helpful to small businesses for all, including Hispanics and Afro Americans. The topic of the mentoring program with HISD was brushed upon in reference to the assistance and involvement of such small businesses tied to the varying communities and also HISD in general.

8. Recent Press Releases

Dan Bankhead announced that the Bond Program is moving very fast with 12 contracts in hand presently and some starter construction sites. It was also brought to attention the recognition HISD and the Bond Program are having with the 2012 Bellfort Childhood Award for its renovation projects and the Award of Value as well as the Crockett school's recognition in *Learning by Design* through the engineering and design scope. Also mentioned were Press releases that included HISD delivering promises made during 2007 construction campaign and HISD's commitment to saving energy as well as bringing more new campuses for HISD students.

Ms De La Fuente that new schools have media coverage with different news outlets; Mr. Dadoush spoke about a job fair with future involvement with the media stating we need a platform. Audio and photography are almost complete with the schools. Mr. Rice mentioned that we could use the still photography in collaboration with the architects and they could avail this information to HISD for future reference to be used as media attention to the work done on new schools and renovation projects.

Executive Summary: Transforming Schools Brick By Brick

September 2012

Major facility upgrades are happening at schools across the city thanks to the \$805 million bond proposal that voters approved in 2007.

Background/History:

- The 2007 Bond program was structured to be funded from various funding sources, in addition to bond funds, that would not be available for several years.
- The bond program was broken out into four major grouping/phases of projects, based on priority needs that would proceed once funding became available for each group/phase.
- Voters approved the 2007 Bond Program in Nov. 2007. The work includes new schools (primarily elementary schools), safety/security improvements and various other district-wide renovations, additions, improvements and upgrades.
- Litigation delayed the start of the bond program for several months.
- Projects have been proceeding as funds became available. The District secured the funding for the entire 2007 Bond Program earlier this year (2012).
- The last group/phase of projects (Group 4) started this quarter now that all funding is available.

HISD made many commitments to the public in 2007, and those commitments are being fulfilled.

Pledges HISD made to taxpayers in 2007 included:

1. Initiate a district-wide effort to upgrade campus safety and security

What's been done:

- New fencing installed at 92 schools
- More than 8,700 additional campus security cameras installed

2. Build 13 new schools to replace aging facilities

What's been done:

• All thirteen schools (Almeda, Berry, Cunningham, DeChaumes, Frost, Gregg, Herod, Horn, Lovett, Roosevelt, Patterson, and Piney Point Elementary Schools, plus Carnegie Vanguard High School) are open and serving our students.

3. Build 3 new schools to relieve crowding

What's been done:

 All three schools (DeAnda Elementary, Neff Elementary, and Billy Reagan K-8 Schools) are open and serving our students.

4. Replace outdated schools with low enrollment with 6 new schools

What's been done:

- Three of those schools (Kennedy, Lewis and Peck Elementary Schools) are open and serving our students.
- Three of those schools (Atherton, Scott/Dogan, and Sherman/Crawford Elementary Schools) are under construction.

5. Expand 2 schools to relieve crowding

What's been done:

 Those two projects (Crockett and Valley West Elementary Schools) are open and serving our students.

6. Build 2 new early college high school (ECHS) facilities and renovate a third one:

What's been done:

- Renovation has been completed at one facility (Central Early College High School)
- Planning/programming is well underway for two new facilities (North ECHS and South ECHS).

7. More than 134 school renovation/repair projects

What's been done:

- Projects have been completed at 67 schools and construction is ongoing at more than 45 other schools throughout the city. This work includes:
 - o Roof replacements/repairs
 - Heating/ventilation and air-conditioning improvements
 - o Americans with Disabilities Act related improvements
 - o Lighting, electrical, and plumbing improvements
 - Door/window improvements
 - Restroom upgrades
 - Science laboratory upgrades

Note: Completed project means that the project is substantially complete and the school is open and serving students. The contractor may be performing and or addressing punch list items and/or warranty related matters.

Exceeding Expectations

More than 50 schools have or will receive renovations, repairs, expansions and/or additional improvements beyond what was originally planned for in the 2007 Bond—all made possible from Trustee allocations and other program realignments.

Introduction Finance Report


HISD 2007 Facilities Capital Program (FCP) continues to move forward with successful momentum. The current overall financial status report for the 2007 Facilities Capital Program comprised of total funding of \$1,176,130,677, actual committed of \$903,874,442 (include encumbrances of \$176,379,214 and actual expenditures of \$727,495,228). This results in an unspent funding to date balance of \$272,256,234. Total actual committed spending is up by 14 % or \$125,758,345 compared to the previous quarter. For the most part, unspent funding is earmarked to complete the Group 4 projects. The majority of the Group 4 projects are scheduled to begin construction in 2013.

The table below provides the school construction projects spending by funding source and outlines the actual funding, actual committed (include encumbrances and actual expenditures), and unspent funding to date from inception through August 21, 2012.




Certified Minority/Women Owned Businesses Breakdown by Project Type






