Lamar High School became an International Baccalaureate authorized school in 1982 with the implementation of the IB Diploma Programme. The Middle Years Programme was implemented in 2003; and the IB Career-related Programme in 2015. Today, as an IB World School, Lamar is the largest IB Programme in the world.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Mirabeau B. Lamar High School opened in the fall of 1937 – celebrating it's 85 year history in 2022. The 1930's design of the school is laced with an Art Deco flare which includes the building's interior/exterior trim of aqua and a limestone relief map of the State of Texas, a registered landmark work of art, above the auditorium entrance.

The new academic building opened in Fall 2019 and is designed to foster **"inquiry-based" project learning and an interdisciplinary approach to teaching and learning**. The renovation of the original North building was also completed in 2019. In Fall 2020, the new athletic fields to support all our athletic programs were completed.

The new facility has a commercial kitchen for our culinary arts program, a black box theatre with a theatre tech workshop, a band hall with practice rooms and an ensemble room, as well as three indoor/outdoor classrooms for our agriculture programs. Also, now available for student use in our new building is a large indoor gymnasium, Olympic competition class pool, and a weight room to enhance our athletic program. The renovation of the historic North Building has provided additional classrooms for fine arts, as well as state of the art learning suites for Business, Accounting, Computer Science, Engineering, Debate, Journalism, Broadcast Journalism, and a fully operation child development center to service as an internship for our students studying Human Services. TEA issued an accountability rating of "Met Standard" –[B +Rating] with 5 of 7 Distinctions.

COLLEGE ATTENDANCE RATES

The Lamar graduates attend colleges and universities across the United States and internationally. **87% of Lamar graduates attend post-secondary degree programs; 70% to four-year universities and 17% to two-year public colleges.** 93% in post- secondary programs continue into their second year [National Student Clearinghouse]. **2023 graduates were offered over \$22.1 million dollars in financial scholarships.**
