Attendance

Any student served by the school district is considered enrolled in the district. A student must be in attendance for at least two hours to be considered present for one-half day and for at least four hours to be considered present for one full day. These time limits refer to instructional time, not including lunch, homeroom, passing periods, or other non-instructional time. Students are responsible for attending all classes each day and being on time in conformity with the compulsory attendance laws of the State of Texas (Tex. Educ. Code §§ 25.085-.086) (HISD Code of Student Conduct, pg. 3). **In accordance with Texas Education Code Section 25.092 (Attendance for Credit 90% Rule); A student at any grade level from kindergarten through grade 12 shall not be given credit or final grade for a class unless the student is in attendance 90 percent of the days in which the class is offered.**

Students are expected to be on time and present each school day. If a student is absent, a written excuse, signed by the parent/guardian, stating the reason for this absence must be provided to the school within a timely manner. The written excuse must be received by the school within three (3) days after the absence. Excuses for absences and tardies are:

- personal illness
- sickness or death in the family
- quarantine
- weather or road conditions making travel dangerous
- participation in school activities with permission of the principal
- juvenile court proceeding documented by a probation officer
- approved college visitation
- emergencies
- or "any other cause acceptable to teacher, principal, or superintendent"

Without the written excuse and within the three (3) days, the absence will be considered as an unexcused absence. After eight consecutive unexcused absences, the parent/guardian will be contacted for an attendance conference with the attendance clerk and an administrator. During this attendance conference the student's daily attendance, grades, attendance contract, and the subsequent steps if more absences are accumulated will be discussed. After ten consecutive absences and/or if the student does not adhere to the rules in the attendance contract, the student(s) parent/guardian is subject to prosecution under Texas Education Code Section 25.093; and the student may be subject to referral to truancy court pursuant to Texas House Bill 2398.

An offense under these sections is a Civil Penalty (Texas House Bill 2398). Each day the child remains out of school after the warning has been given/sent or the child has been ordered to attend school by the juvenile court may constitute as a separate offense. A parent/guardian is subject to a fine ranging from \$100 to \$500 per offense after this warning notice (Texas House Bill 2398).

If the student is absent an automated call will be sent, or a staff member will be contacting the parent/guardian of the student's absence.

Tardiness

Students are required to be on time to school and class, each day. Daily Attendance (ADA) is taken during 2nd period every day. Students who are tardy to class will be given a tardy in PowerSchool and/or the Hero System. If students are in the hallway when the tardy bell rings, students will receive a Cougar demerit/mark. Tardies will be recorded and tracked via the Hero system and in PowerSchool.

Students must be present at least 35 minutes of the class period (or 60 minutes of a 90-minute class period) in order to be considered in attendance unless they are participating on a field trip or other activity approved by the principal. Unexcused tardies are not converted to unexcused absences. Tardies are a disciplinary issue. If you have any questions or concerns regarding attendance, please contact the attendance clerk, Ms. Cano, or an administrator.

Dress Code

The following dress code is proposed to ensure a safe and productive learning environment for all students. The Houston Independent School District lends the responsibility to the student to dress according to the dress code adopted by each individual school (HISD Code of Student Conduct, pg. 3). Students must have their lanyard and ID visible.

Articles of clothing should not display profane language/gestures, references to illicit activities or paraphernalia, or obscenities. **Clothing must be free of holes, rips, and/or slits.** Clothes must be well fitting, and not showing excessive skin. Caps, bandanas, hoodies, or any other head coverings may not be worn in the building. Hoodies with print are not allowed. P.E. uniforms are to be worn at P.E., not in the hallways. **No house shoes, flip flops, or Crocs will be worn.** No tights, leggings, or pj bottoms will be allowed. On Fridays students may wear a college or spirit shirt with jeans. Jeans cannot have tears, holes, or rips.

Students who do not abide by the dress code policy will receive a phone call home and disciplinary action.

If there is a need in purchasing/acquiring the mentioned school dress code requirements, please notify an administrator, the wraparound specialist, or school counselor.

Student Discipline Standards

Parents/guardians and students are responsible to review the *HISD Code of Student Conduct*. It is available on the Houston I.S.D. website. The HISD Code of Student Conduct details the expectations for student behavior, the level of misbehaviors, and consequences.

At Holland Middle School we have developed student guidelines to ensure a safe and positive learning culture. Students are responsible to adhering to the following standards:

1. Students are expected to arrive at school and class on time (8:25) everyday.
2. Students are expected to attend school everyday in compliance with Tex. Educ. Code §§ 25.085-.086.
3. Students are expected to respect administrators, teachers, staff, and peers at all times.
4. Students are expected to follow the given dress code guidelines everyday.
5. Students are expected to come to school ready to learn with the necessary materials and supplies.
6. Students are expected to follow all bus and bus stop rules to ensure a safe arrival to school and departure from school.

7. Students are expected to treat the given technology with care and respect.
8. Students are expected to respect school property and not deface or destroy it.
9. Students are expected to follow the HISD Code of Student Conduct in regards to drugs/control substances. If any illegal substances are possessed by a student, this will be a legal issue and referred to the campus police officer.
10. Students are expected to resolve conflict in a positive manner. Fighting, harassment, and/or bullying will not be allowed.

To ensure all behaviors are documented, we will utilize the Hero system to document/track minor infractions. Parents/guardians will have access to view student discipline infractions in the Hero System.

2023-2024 Cell Phone and Electronic Policy

1. **Cell phones must be given to the 1st period teacher every day and cannot be on the student during the instructional day.** The instructional day includes but is not limited to class time, passing periods, lunch, after school detention, tutorials, and fire drills. Cell phones are only allowed while they are waiting for the instructional day to begin (morning arrival). The first period teacher will collect cell phones during the first period class period and place the cellphones in a secured locked box. Cell Phone locked boxes will be transferred to a secure location until the end of the day. Cell phone locked boxes will be returned to the students 5th period class.
2. Parents, if you need to contact your child during the school day, please call 713-671-3860 and the message will be given to your child.
3. If a student is leaving early, the student will be allowed to retrieve their cell phone from the secured location.
4. Cell phones will not be allowed during any administration of an assessment.
5. Students are not allowed to possess radios, MP3 players, earbuds, Airpods, headphones, video or audio recorders, DVD players, games, cameras, E-electronics or other electronic devices at school unless it is for instructional purposes or has been given administrative approval.

If the cell phone/electronic policy is not adhered to, this will result in the following consequences:

1st Violation: Confiscation of cell phone and the student may receive cell phone at the end of the current instructional day.

2nd Violation: Confiscation of cell phone and the student may receive cell phone at the end of the current instructional day, if the parent comes to pick up the cell phone.

3rd Violation: Confiscation of the cell phone, parent contact and \$15.00 administrative fee.

4th Violation: Administrative assigned In School Suspension.

5th Violation: Administrative assigned Out of School Suspension.

Transportation Safety Rules

Below are the safety rules for students utilizing HISD

Parents/Guardians

- Parents are strongly encouraged to make bus stops safer by escorting children to the bus stop.
- Talk about bus safety with your child.
- Escort your child to the bus stop in the morning.

Students

- Be early! Arrive at least 10 minutes ahead of time.
- Wait for the bus in an orderly manner.
- Wait for the driver's signal before crossing the street.
- Cross the street at least ten feet in front of the bus.
- Never walk behind or crawl under a school bus.
- Never go back to the bus for anything you may have dropped or left behind.
- Never run to or from the bus.
- Remove or secure drawstrings, straps, and the like, or any piece of clothing or accessory (book bag, etc.) that could get caught in the bus door or handrails.
- Always obey the driver.
- Stay in your seat.
- Keep your hands, arms, and head inside the bus.

Motorists

- Be on the lookout for children. They can appear suddenly and without notice out from behind stopped school buses.
- Please obey the posted speed limit in school zones. Children may be present in the area at any time, but are especially present when the lights on the school zone sign are flashing.
- Please keep your eyes out for crossing guards when children are walking to and from school. Failure to stop for a crossing guard carries the same penalty as failure to stop for a traffic light or a stop sign.
- When the yellow warning lights on the bus flash, this lets motorists know that the bus will be stopping to load or unload students. Please slow down and prepare to stop instead of speeding up to pass the bus.

Positive Incentives

Students will have opportunities to earn incentives for positive behavior while at school. Incentives may be used to promote positive behavior and increase academic participation. If a student is displaying positive behavior, a Cougar Point in the Hero system or a Cougar Buck will be awarded. Cougar Points/Bucks are

obtained throughout the year and students have the opportunity to receive rewards and special privileges. All teachers, administrators, and staff are encouraged to recognize the students that are following appropriate behavior.

Student Technology and Online Etiquette

Technology Acceptable Use Policy 2023-2024

Holland Middle School provides access to Chromebooks for on campus use in addition to desktop computers and other technology equipment. In order for students to use HISD devices and accounts, we require all students to comply with our technology policies.

As a Holland M.S. student, I will not...

Use technology to interrupt learning.

- I will not use school technology for games, social networking, or anything other than educational tasks. **Harass or abuse others.**
- I will not use technology to be unkind or abusive in any way.
- I will not write, post, or view anything that I would not want my teachers, parents, and administration to see. **Use any technology without permission.**
- I will not use technology in class unless instructed to do so.
- I will not use employee equipment or applications without prior authorization and proper supervision.

Damage or alter technology equipment and programs. ● I will not vandalize any school property.

- I will not change settings or programs on school devices without authorization from IT Administration.
- I will not remove inventory tracking tags such as HISD asset and serial number stickers.
- I will not download files or install programs on school workstations or laptops without permission from my teachers.
- I will not use unauthorized USB drives from home on campus workstations because they present a risk of virus infection.
- I will not physically damage technology equipment including but not limited to: scratching, marking, dropping, bending, writing on, or otherwise misusing them.
- I will not store additional items in the Chromebook compartment other than the laptop itself.
- I will not eat or drink near technology equipment. **Avoid unsafe or dishonest**

internet practices.

- I will not share my login and password.
- I will not log into computers or programs with anything other than my school account.
- I will not use technology to cheat or copy someone else's work.
- I will never share my personal information such as my phone number or home address online or in emails.

Health And Medicine

Holland Middle School has a full time nurse available on campus each school day. The nurse is responsible for caring for students who become ill during the instructional day. If a student becomes ill during the instructional day, the student will be given a nurse's pass from his/her teacher, administrator, or clerk to report to the nurse's office for medical assistance. The student will have to sign in upon entering the nurse's office. If the nurse determines that the student needs further medical attention, the nurse will call the parent/guardian to pick up his/her child from school.

If a student has a medical condition that requires daily assistance from the nurse, communicate this medical condition to the nurse by providing a physician's note and detailed instructions.

Students are not permitted to carry any medication on them or in his/her backpack while at school. This includes over the counter medications such as pain relievers (i.e Ibuprofen, Aspirin, Tylenol, Midol, Aleve) and cough drops. HISD Board Policy prohibits school personnel from administering any medication, including aspirin. If a child must take medication while at school, the school nurse will provide parents/guardians with a form that must be signed by a physician. Upon receipt of the signed form, medications will be administered in the clinic under the nurse's supervision. Student's that take medication at home are encouraged to communicate with the nurse or grade level administrator so that the campus is aware of the individual case and potential side effects in the event the child becomes ill at school.

All students are required to have current and updated immunizations as required by law. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to provide the school nurse with an accurate immunization record. If the student does not have an updated immunization record the nurse will contact the parent/guardian, inform the parent/guardian of the missing immunizations, and provide the parent/guardian with resources to acquire the needed immunizations.

If your child requires eyeglasses, it is imperative that the student wears the glasses daily; this will impact his/her learning. Vision screenings will be conducted by the school nurse and you will be notified if she recommends your child see an optometrist.

The nurse may also conduct hearing screenings throughout the school year. The nurse will contact the parent/guardian if there is a need for further evaluation.

Social Emotional Support

At Holland Middle School there are two full time certified school counselors to assist with your social emotional needs. The school counselors provide student and/or family counseling sessions, behavioral

health supports, and resources. If there is a need for social emotional support contact a grade level administrator, teacher, or the school counselors Ms. Haley or Ms. Cone at 713-671-3860.

Wraparound Services

Wraparound Services connects students and their families with community-resources that address the non-academic challenges that students face which ultimately impact their ability to learn. Wraparound Resource Specialists will use a data-based approach to identify students in need, and to connect them to the appropriate non-academic supports that address critical issues such as mental health and physical needs, food insecurity, lack of stable housing, violence, incarceration of a parent, legal and crisis support and many other challenges that can have adverse effects on a student's readiness and ability to learn.

SCHOOL SAFETY PLAN

The community of Holland is committed to our #1 Core Value: Safety Above All Else. Several safety measures have been implemented to ensure the safety and security of all students, faculty and staff at Holland Middle School.

Drills: Monthly drills are performed as required by state law to practice procedures in case of a fire, disaster or intruder in the building.

Intruder Drill: Intruder drills will take place frequently throughout the year to ensure the safety of the students.

Building Entrance: The doors to the building are locked for safety. Visitors are to enter at the front of the building at the main entrance. Ring the buzzer which is located to the right of the door so that someone may activate the mechanism to unlock the door and allow one to enter the building.

ID Badges: All visitors must sign in with the receptionist and present a valid government issued I.D. A visitor badge will be issued to be worn visibly while visiting the building.

Campus officer: We have an officer assigned to our campus to assist with the security needs of the campus.

 - Parents may contact teachers by email, phone, or Remind App to set up a conference
3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their child/children's progress. Progress reports will be provided the third week of each marking period. Report Cards will be provided one week from the end of a 6 weeks marking period.
4. Utilize callouts/emails, the school's social media, and marquee to communicate important meeting dates and other information.
5. Provide opportunities for parents to volunteer and participate in their child/children's activities once VIPs approved.
 - Field Trip accompaniment
 - Chaperone for dances, sports, clubs, etc.
 - Participate in school engagement activities.
 - Volunteer to start a PTO



Parent Responsibilities:

Es práctica de Holland Middle School enviar a casa toda la correspondencia escolar en inglés y español para garantizar que toda la información relacionada con nuestra escuela sea comprensible. Las llamadas telefónicas de School Messenger se realizan tanto en inglés como en español. La información en el sitio web de nuestra escuela, las aplicaciones de comunicación y las redes sociales (Facebook , Twitter/X e Instagram) está disponible en inglés y español. Holland Middle School tiene mucho personal que habla español para ayudar con la traducción, cuando sea necesario.

8. Para garantizar la participación efectiva de los padres y apoyar una asociación entre la escuela, los padres y la comunidad para mejorar el rendimiento académico de los estudiantes, el campus desarrollará la capacidad de las escuelas y los padres para una fuerte participación de los padres y la familia mediante la implementación de ACTIVIDADES DE POLÍTICA OPCIONALES.

Holland Middle School no está implementando actividades de políticas opcionales actualmente.

9.
