Minutes

- Ms. Garson is taking the minutes

Attendance

- Our attendance is well below 98 and we need to work on that
- Next year we do not know about the budget
- We are looking at \$140,000 cut and will have to tighten our belt. Mr. Buck does not plan on anyone losing their jobs, but we will have to be creative with the money
- Any TAs that leave will not be replaced
- Mr. Buck will have to come to us once the budget is released and it will not be decided by June
- The law says that any teachers that are cut need to be told 10 days before the end of the school year, which again Mr. Buck does not plan on losing any teachers
- How they were going to absorb the costs at the district level has not been decided but has to be decided by the June Board Meeting
- They have cut down on central processes and a lot of money goes to maintenance
- Anything we do not spend this year will roll over to next year
- Usually Mr. Buck tries to spend the majority of the budget but the end of the school year
- We will try to have about \$10,000 roll over
- There is a hiring freeze in many areas in central administration because they are looking at closing many positions
- If students are sick we do not want them here, but we have to make sure that students are coming to school
- We need to use the nurse as much as we can to assist and make sure students come to school

Discipline

- Overall we are still below last year's numbers
- We know that students are building relationships with their teachers as the discipline referrals have decreased. We also know that we need to look to the teachers to help with ideas on discipline.
- Students have discovered that they can use phones in the classrooms to call 911, everyone needs to be aware of this.
- The 911 calls have happened 2 different times, we do not want this to happen
- We were warned that the next time that it happens we are being advised a ticket may be issued.
- This goes back to the supervision and systems in the classrooms
- Hopefully this will send a message that students should not call 911
- Next year there are no suspensions for any reasons from PK-2

Academics

- Whitten: STAAR tests are coming up and if there are any retests for 5th grade, then that will happen in May
- The students who have passed 100% on ST Math can use Think Through Math
- Ms. Garson discussed that the Spanish Math teachers in Dual Language may want to pull small groups for testing their English speakers to ensure that they do as best as they possibly can
- We will try to get all of the End of Year assessments completed by the end of the week of May 13th
- DRA testing will be moved to 5/2. Remember if teachers are keeping up with running records a separate DRA is not necessary.

Dual Language

- Dual Language Parent Meeting Tuesday, April 12th at 4PM
- The End of Year running records will take the place of the multiple choice end of year test

Early Dismissal

- There will be no early dismissal waivers next year
- We can do 5 full days and 5 half days/ early dismissal days
- The full days would be 2 academic and 3 can be instructional professional development (can use half for report card days)
- They are no longer doing the early dismissal waivers
- Ms. Maclaine asked if principals could speak with each other about schedules
- Right now the SSO has 9 schools that are spread out all over the district and not in the same feeder pattern, but it would be beneficial to work with others in the same feeder pattern
- Early dismissals interfere with parents who are working
- Ms. Maclaine understands that teachers do not have time
- We can try to schedule the 5 full days on bank holidays so that some of the parents might not have to work those days
- If teachers do not come in on professional development days, then they aren't paid
- We can do President's Day and Columbus Day

Safety and Dismissal

- The carpool line is still going until 3:45PM and some parents are coming at 3:30PM to avoid the line
- The students are getting out of the cafeteria faster and to the carpool line faster
- We could stop the line with cones at 3:30PM
- We can revisit the late arrivals staying in the cafeteria to discourage parents coming later

Activity Funds

Facility Concerns

- Everything that we asked is going to be done next January
- The person in charge of the custodians, there are not any new custodians that will be hired due to the hiring freeze
