### Briscoe Elementary School 2017 – 2018 Parent and Family Engagement Policy CAMPUS POLICY REQUIREMENTS

At Briscoe Elementary, we believe that if students are to be successful, their parents must be actively involved in their education. The Briscoe staff wants to work as a partner with parents to help the students to achieve high expectations and become academically successful.

The Briscoe Parent and Family Engagement Policy and School-Parent Compact were jointly developed with the Title I parents and will be periodically reviewed and revised as necessary. At the beginning of each year, the parents are invited and encouraged to attend an annual Open House meeting. At that meeting, the Principal reviews the Title I law, its requirements, and the rights of the Title I parents to be involved in their child's education. There are a minimum of four parent meetings offered during the school year at different times of the day, morning or evening, including the Open House. Some of these meetings will include parent education sessions such as Family Learning Nights. At the meetings, the parents are encouraged to participate in the planning, review, and improvement of the Parent and Family Engagement Policy and to be involved in their child's education. The Principal reviews school test data, AYP (Adequate Yearly Progress) data, the various academic assessments used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet. A description and explanation of the curriculum at the school will be reviewed and distributed in writing to all parents. Additional meetings for parents to have more opportunities to participate in decisions relating to the education of their children may be scheduled if requested by parents, as practically possible. If the school-wide Parent and Family Engagement Policy is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, Briscoe will submit the parents' comments to the Department of External Funding. The plan will then be revised as advised by the HISD Title I, Part A Parental Involvement Program Administrator and other District designees. (Section 1118(e)-(1-5)

School-Parent Compact: A child is more effectively educated when the school, the parents, and the child share in the responsibility. The Briscoe School-Parent Compact was developed jointly with parents of Title I students and explains how the parents, the school staff, and the students share responsibility for each student's improved student academic achievement and success. - Responsibilities of the Parents / Guardians: to support their child's learning by monitoring attendance, making sure they complete their homework, and monitoring time spent viewing television and playing electronic games, etc. Parents are encouraged to help their children make positive use of their time outside of school (extracurricular) so that education is a top priority.

Parents will have access to the teacher / principal by scheduling an appointment through the main office or talking to the teacher directly. They are also encouraged to participate in school activities and volunteer at the school if at all possible. (Section 1118(c)-(6)

Building Capacity for Involvement: Throughout the year, parent training is conducted at Briscoe to educate the parents in how they can help their children achieve success. It is part of the school's role and responsibility to teach parents how to help their children learn. To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, Briscoe will build the capacity of the school and the parents for strong parental involvement by implementing the required policy activities.

#### The school:

- ✓ will assist parents in understanding the TEKS, STAAR, IOWA, Logramos, TELPAS, H.F.W.E. and all of the assessments used, how to monitor their child's progress, and how to work with the educators to improve achievement of their children. This will occur at Title I Parent meetings and will also be sent home in written form as well in the Description & Explanation of the Curriculum and Assessments. Parents who have internet access may register on Houston ISD's
  - PS Connect which enables them to view assignments, grades, progress reports, etc. The Title I Contact Person is available if assistance is needed to register;
- ✓ will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children through Family Learning events
- will educate teachers and all staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, how to reach out to parents and communicate with them. Teachers and staff will be trained in how to work with parents as equal partners, how to implement parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school. This will occur during monthly Faculty Meetings and weekly PLC (Primary Learning Community) meetings. Parents will be invited to at least one faculty meeting to assist with this;
- will ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to the parents in a format and language the parents can understand. All communication and correspondence is sent via notes, flyers, phone calls in Spanish and English which are the two languages spoken by Briscoe parents at this time;
- ✓ will provide reasonable support for parental involvement activities. Parents are encouraged to become a VIP and volunteer at the school. They have access to the parent computers in the Title I Room and may utilize Imagine Learning English (Literacy training) and other software programs offered by the school;
- ✓ will coordinate and integrate parental engagement programs and activities with other local programs. The Principal is in contact with the programs offered in our area and communicates with them to the extent feasible and appropriate.
