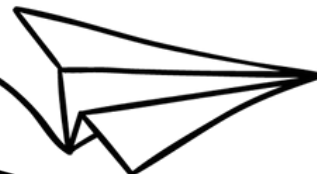

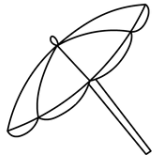
Ethics & Violations of Academic Integrity

- If work was due the day you were gone, it is STILL due THAT DAY unless you communicated to Mr. Morin and received a different response.

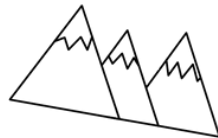

Extra credit opportunities will be posted on Canvas when they arise. DO NOT ask for it!



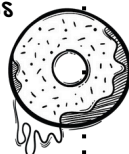
Retakes

Assignments Explained



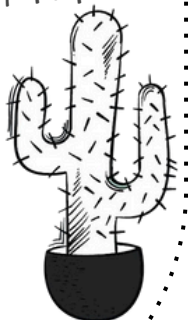
Formative Assessment: Assess ONE skill or concept to see knowledge being FORMED.

Summative Assessment: Assess MULTIPLE skills or concepts to SUMMARIZE knowledge learned.

Professionalism: Reflects student's mastery of soft skills needed for future careers.
