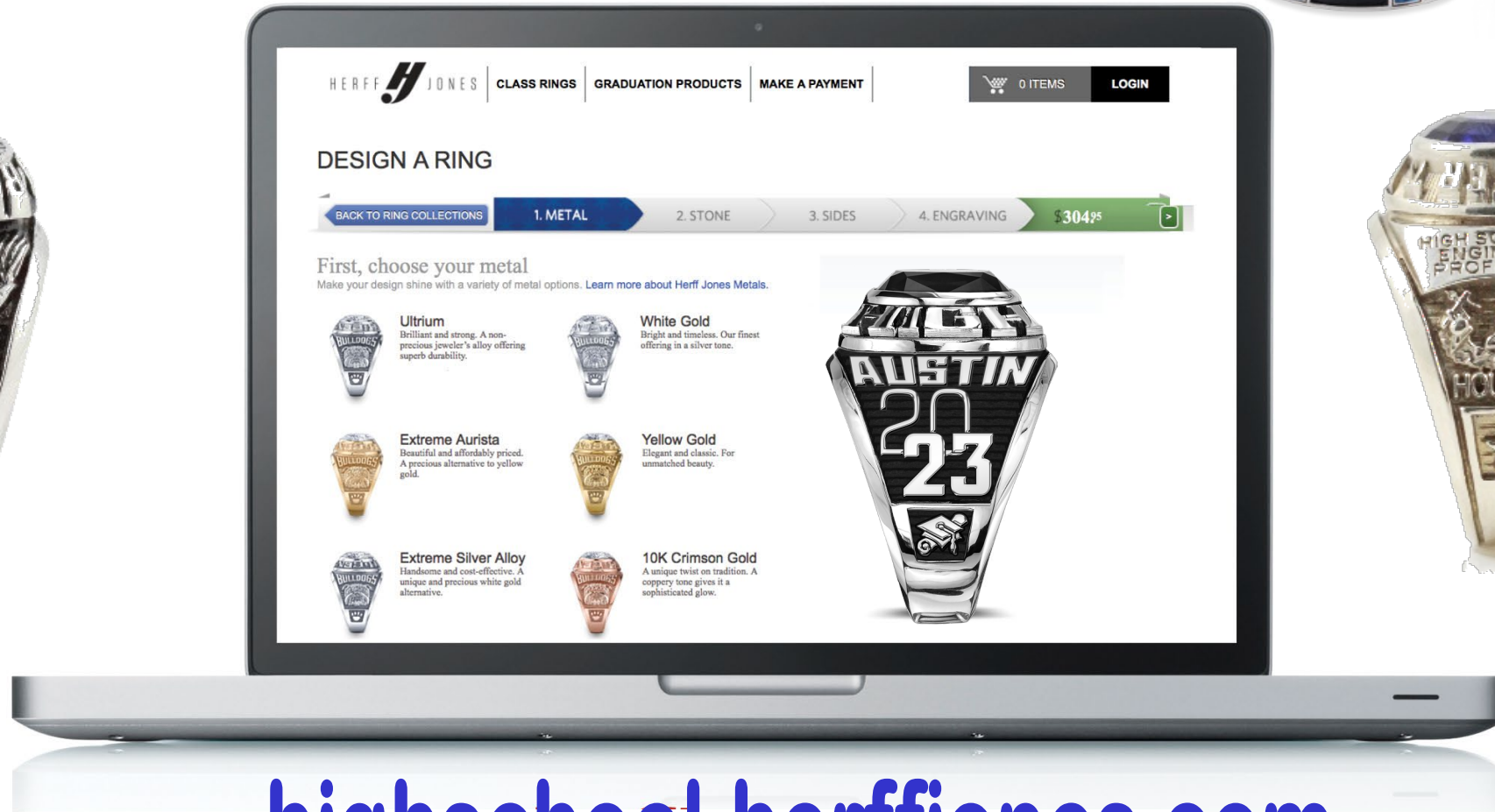

Attendance

- State law TEC §25.092 and Houston ISD Policy still require students to attend at least 90% of their classes to receive credit and be promoted. Remote attendance will count in the same manner as on-campus (face-to-face) attendance in satisfying this requirement.
- Excessive absences in any class will result in a loss of credit in that class, regardless of earning a passing grade. This will be signified by the letters NG on the transcript and report card.
- The NG will only be removed from a transcript once the appeal process has been completed. It may only be removed from the campus it was obtained from.
- Students must **participate** in all classes **EVERY** day whether virtual (TOL) or face-to-face.

Asistencia

- La ley estatal TEC §25.092 y la Política del Distrito Escolar Independiente de Houston todavía requieren que los estudiantes asistan al menos al 90% de sus clases para recibir crédito y ser promovidos. La asistencia remota contará de la misma manera que la asistencia en el campus (presencial) para satisfacer este requisito.
- Las ausencias excesivas en cualquier clase resultarán en una pérdida de crédito en esa clase, independientemente de haber obtenido una calificación aprobatoria. Esto se indicará con las letras NG en el expediente académico y en la boleta de calificaciones.
- El NG solo se eliminará de una transcripción una vez que se haya completado el proceso de apelación. Solo se puede retirar del campus de donde se obtuvo.
- Los estudiantes deben **participar** en todas las clases **TODOS** los días, ya sean virtuales (TOL) o presenciales.

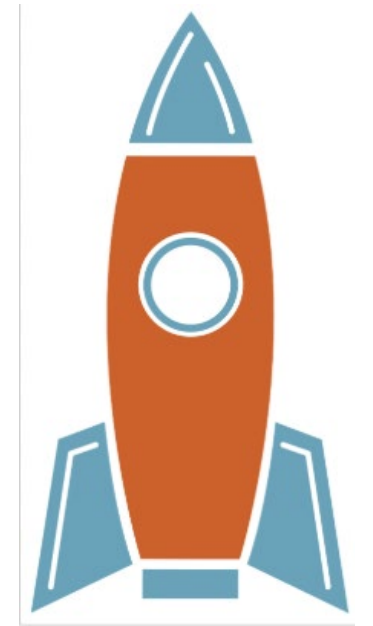

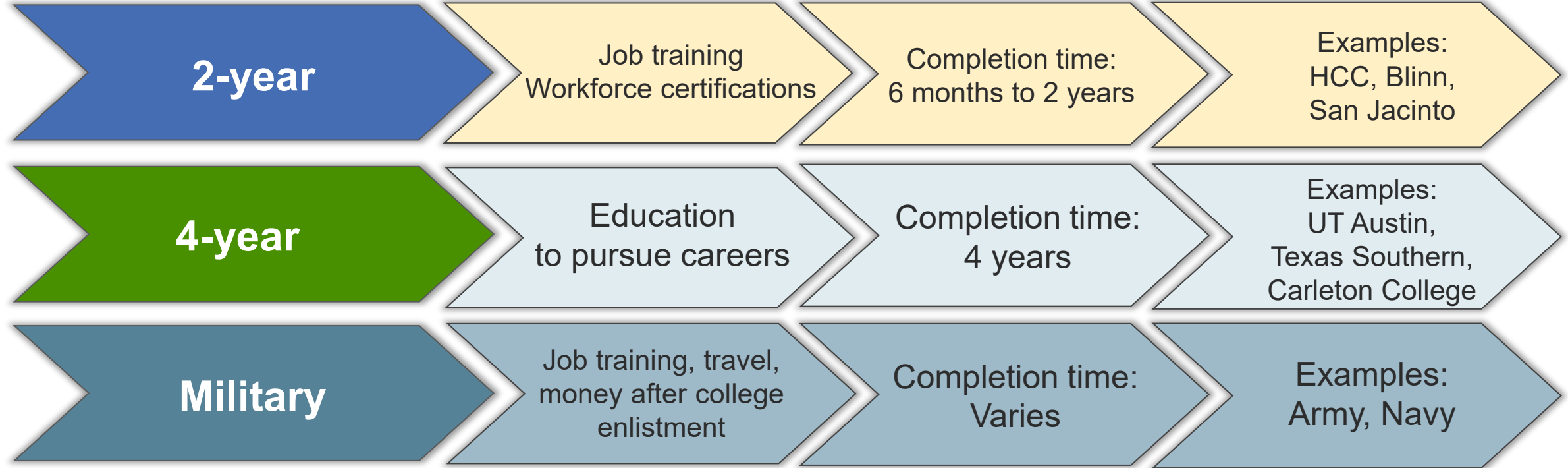

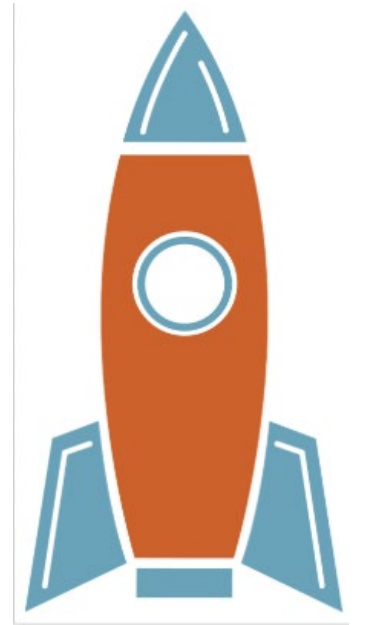

Tuition & Fees: The amount a student pays for college classes and any extra fees.



Books & Supplies: Textbooks needed for each class and any additional supplies or required materials

Personal & Transportation: Additional expenses such as laundry, cell phone service, going out money, and flights home throughout the year.

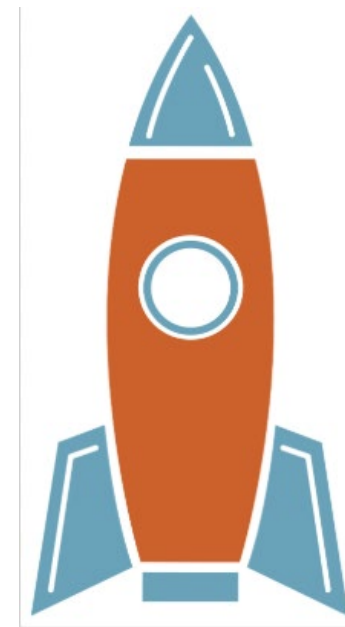

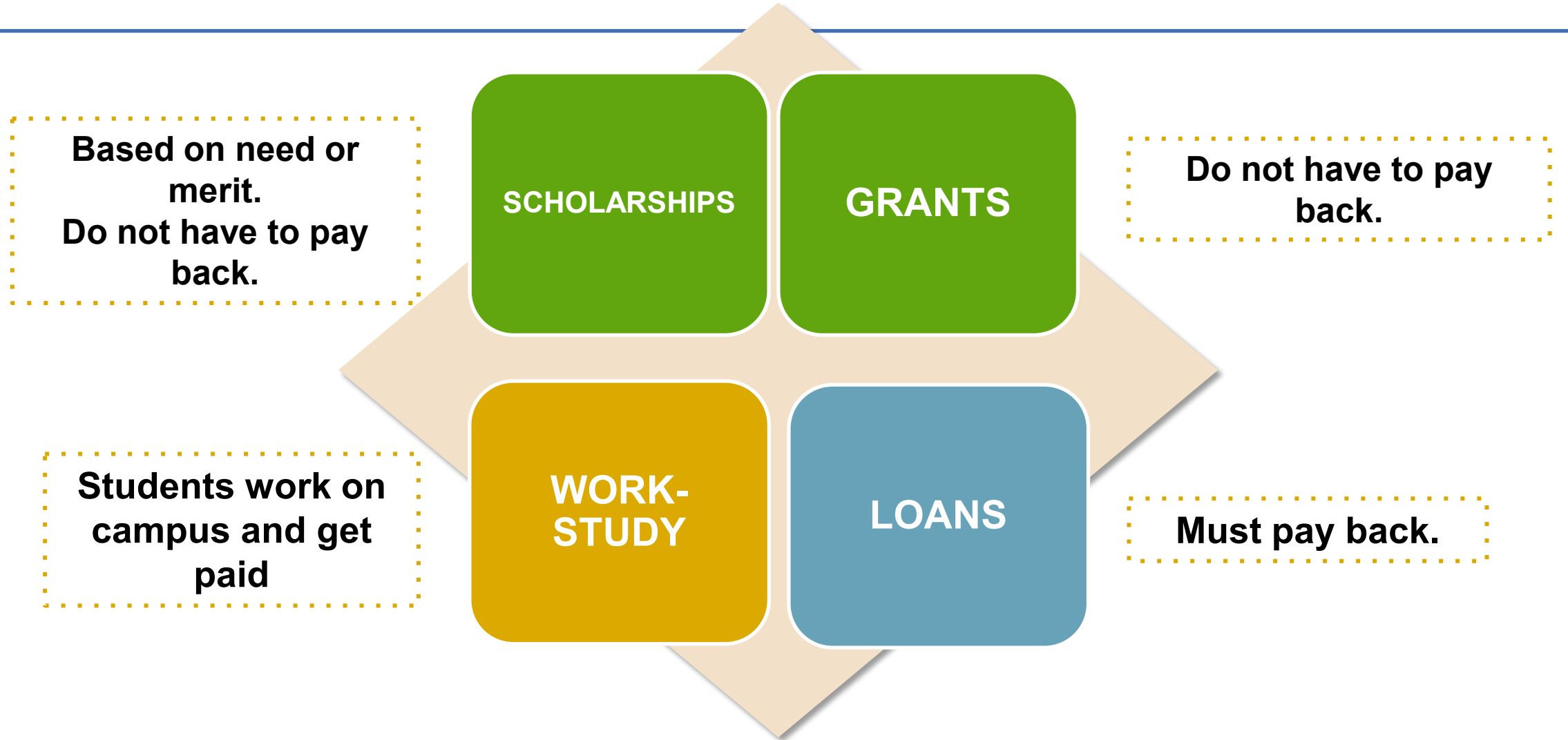


WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

Any grant, scholarship, loan, or paid employment offered to help a student pay for college. It may be based off of “need”, “merit”, or a combination of both.

EXPECTED FAMILY CONTRIBUTION (EFC)

Expected Family Contribution is calculated by a formula that considers your family's income, assets and size. It is used by colleges to help determine your "financial need".



House Bill 3 Financial Aid Requirement

In 2019 the 86th Texas Legislature established a financial aid graduation requirement for all Texas high school seniors. **There are 2 ways for students to meet this requirement.**

- 1) Submit Financial Aid (FAFSA/TASFA)
- 2) Submit TEA Opt-Out Form



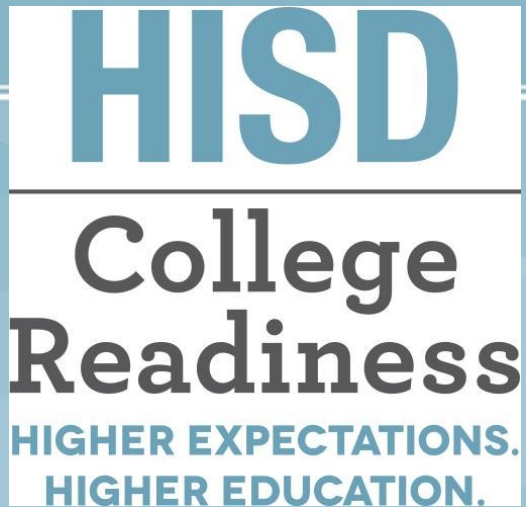

Sample Senior Contract

DEAR PARENTS/STUDENTS OF THE CLASS OF 2023,

Booker T. Washington High School would like to make Senior activities available and affordable to every student.

Every student must have a contract on file to participate in senior activities and engagements. The senior contract is set up so that your child's senior activities can be paid for in installments, if needed. This will help students and parents because the whole amount will not be due at one time. You sign up and pay for the package items you would like to participate in.

INCLUDED IN THE CONTRACT ARE THE FOLLOWING:

Graduation Cap and Gown: Seniors will begin ordering their commencement ceremony cap and gown at the end of the first semester of school to ensure that they receive them in time for any senior pictures they would like to take on their own second semester.

Senior Breakfast and Picnic: A gathering of Seniors to reflect and celebrate this special time in your child's life. This breakfast will be held on a weekday morning, will include breakfast, entertainment, a guest speaker, and much more. The picnic will be possibly held at a park in Houston (Location TBD – based on CDC and district guidelines) and will entail several outdoor activities students may participate in for a true bonding experience. For the Senior Breakfast, senior students are **REQUIRED** to dress in black, blue, or gold business professional attire. For the Senior picnic, Seniors are to wear a BTW t-shirt and jeans with no rips or holes (No inappropriate shorts or revealing tops).

Senior Pictures: Seniors will take yearbook pictures the second semester of school. These pictures will be available for purchase **SEPARATELY**. For the senior pictures, young men need to wear a white, long sleeve button-down shirt with black slacks and a black tie. Young ladies will need to wear black and/or white business professional dress/dress suit.

Senior T-Shirts: It is a Washington High School tradition that the Senior class creates a custom t-shirt when they graduate. The Senior class will create designs that the senior class will vote on at the Senior Breakfast or at another specified time. The Senior T-shirt will include the class roster on the back of the shirt also.

Senior Virtual or In-Person Game Night: BTW Seniors will meet on a virtual platform or at a specified location to have a night of fun, games, music, and bonding with a full virtual breakout room experience.

Prom: The biggest and most elegant of all senior activities is the Prom. The Prom price includes – the location, music, food, and gifts (if Gold package). Students will be provided with a specific dress code outlining the do's and don'ts for prom attire. (Location: Tentatively Hilton Americas Downtown)

Senior Yearbook: The plan is for students to be able to purchase a yearbook from the vendor. Details will be provided once our Yearbook Sponsor discloses the information to the Senior sponsor for ordering. Seniors usually have about 4 customizable pages that they can create via the yearbook app with photos of memories from their four years in high school if they choose to do so.

Panoramic Class Picture: Seniors traditionally take horizontal picture with all class members which is placed into our hallway for students to see each class that has graduated from Booker T. Washington High School.

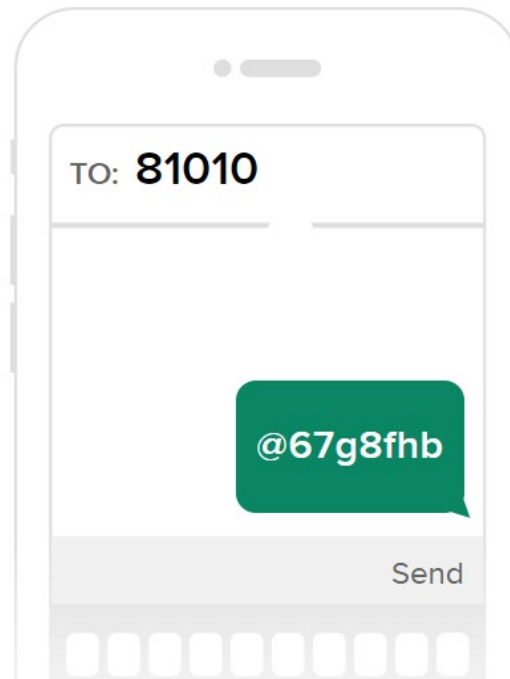

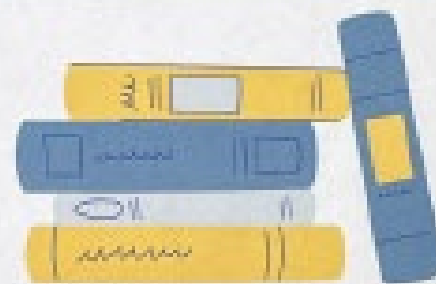
