
Shared Reading at Home



Shared Reading is an interactive reading experience that occurs when students join in or share the reading of a book or other text while guided and supported by a caretaker.







Research Shows

- According to the National Center for Education Statistics, children who are read to at home enjoy reading a lot more over children who are not read to.
- Researchers suggest, "The single most important activity for building these understandings and skills essential for reading success appears to be reading aloud to children." (Wells 1985; Bus, Van Ijzendoorn, & Pellegrini 1995).
- Asking predictive and analytical questions as you read affect children's vocabulary and comprehension in substantial way that will benefit in their overall comprehension skills. (Karweit & Wasik 1996).





During Reading At Home

Take your time

- Read at your own pace
- Look for meaning of unfamiliar words

Interactive


- Ask and encourage child to ask questions about the book
- Ask to Connect:
 - Text-Self
 - Text-Text
 - Text-World

Discuss

- Share opinions
- Ask to read and write thoughts about the story

Reading Aloud Strategies



Side By Side Reading

Reading parent and child sit next to each other and read together at the same time



Echo Reading

Echo what is said. Parent reads and child repeats what is read




Partner Reading

Parent reads a page, child reads a page and it goes back and forth



Round Robin Reading

Everyone takes turns reading and passes the book around the circle

organizer.

Rough Draft

Begin writing!
Skip lines and remember to "show not tell."
It doesn't have to be perfect yet!

Revise

Whisper Read

Use a BLUE
map pencil. Do
your sentences
make sense?
Are your
details on
topic?
Anything you
need to add?

Edit

Partner Editing

Use a RED map
pencil. Check
for correct
spelling and
punctuation.
Make any
additions that
will make the
paper better.

Final COPY

Write your final copy in your best handwriting. Do NOT skip lines and only write on the front. Remember a title!


Why is Writing Important

 Every day, we need to write in order to complete our tasks, whether we are filling out a form at the doctor's office or writing an important letter. These tasks require us to write clearly and organize information effectively.



Experts Groups Explain...

Writing is an important element of a student's education



Writing is an important form of communication

Writing can be an important outlet

Research shows



The ability to read and write does not develop naturally, without careful planning and instruction.



Children acquire a working knowledge of the alphabetic system not only through reading but also through writing



Children need to learn not only the technical skills of reading and writing but also how to use these tools to better their thinking and reasoning



Children need regular and active interactions with print. Specific abilities required for reading and writing come from immediate experiences with oral and written language.
