ExemptionsContacts: Mr. Tellez & Mrs. Williams

Seniors may exempt exams in the spring semester if they have no unexcused absences in an ADA period (2nd and 6th) and no more than three total absences in ADA (2nd and 6th) for the spring semester.

For individual classes, all of the following conditions must also be met:

- No more than three total excused absences and no unexcused absences for the semester.
- 85 average or better in the course for the semester.
- S or E conduct average.
- Discretion of the teacher.

District and Community

Houston ISD, with more than 209,000 students and encompassing 301 square miles within greater Houston, is the seventh-largest public-school system in the nation and the largest in Texas. HISD is among the largest employers in Houston, with approximatery 27,395 full and part-time employees. Most HISD personnel are assigned to schools and deliver services directly to students on a dey-to-day basis. Its schools are dedicated to giving every student the best possible education through an intensive core curriculum and specialized, challenging instructional and career programs. The district is extremely diverse with the following ethnic student breakdown: 62% Hispanic, 24% Afriban American, 9% White, 4% Asian and 75% economically-disadvantaged.

The School

HSPVA evolved in 1971 from a realization that gifted young artists need highly specialized. and rigorous training in the arts to be prepared for the intense competition they will meet in colleges, conservatories, and the professional arts world. The creation of HSPVA represented the first attempt by any public high school in the nation to correlate an academic program with concentrated training in the arts. Also, it was one of only three public schools in the nation to offer programs in both the visual and performing arts, and the first such institution in the southwest. For Houston ISD, the formation of HSPVA represented a dramatic departure from traditional comprehensive programs. In 2019, the school transitioned to our new building in downtown Houston and was renamed Kinder High School for the Performing and Visual Arts, Kinder HSPVA is fully accredited and offers the same academic curriculum and graduation requirements as all HISD high schools; the major difference in the academic program is that we offer the added ingredient of correlating the arts with academics, rather than treating either as isolated disciplines. The school schedule is an alternating A/B block schedule with classes meeting for 1.5 hours every other day with the exception of first period which meets every day for 45 minutes. Students spend three hours every day in rigorous focused study in one art discipline with the balance of the day's study in academics. All students must audition for placement at Kinder HSPVA and are accepted to a single art area of focus-

Students taking AP are required to take the exam in May & AP test fees are paid by Houston ISD.

Teacher Rec Reminders

- Students will request all Kinder HSPVA teachers recs through Naviance
 <u>AFTER having a personal conversation to ask for the rec</u> (should have
 asked last May).
- *Non-HSPVA staff will be requested directly through Common App, an institutional online process or will be sent by mail.
- Students should select "all current and future schools" unless they need specific teachers to submit for specific schools.
- Students may still invite teachers to submit directly to colleges if that is the preferred process for the institution (UT Austin for example).



September

- Finalize College List: Include at least one "safe" school
- Find a school that fits you.... prefer small, medium, large, public, private, community, in-state, out of state college/university
- Market yourself-College Fairs, visits, emails, local events, lunchtime visits
- Senior Conferences beginning soon
- Review transcripts for accuracy
