Understand How Your GPA Works

- A GPA is your Grade Point Average
- Every semester grade is given a GPA point and averaged together to determine a GPA.

Academic courses are on a 4.0 scale
AP and Honors courses are on a 5.0 scale
Each semester grade is made up of 3 cycle
grades and a final

 High school credit taken in middle school does not go into your GPA
