LAZARUS ENERGY EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM The Lazarus Energy Empowerment Program (LEEP) provides a paid year-long internship to expose high school students to the broad spectrum of jobs available in the energy industry, along with providing professional life and leadership development that will prepare the interns for the world of work and success in whatever field they ultimately choose. The internship has four main components: Personal Development, College Prep, Career Exposure and an introduction to the Energy Industry, the program brings in guest speakers monthly and suddens participate in field trips as well. The interns will also participate in an entrepreneurship crash course where they come up with their own idea and present it 5the group. LEEP is a year-long commitment from June to May. 




