My job here is to assist referred 9th and 10th grade students who find themselves struggling with truancy issues (missing school, skipping classes etc.) My goal with

each client is to find out what the challenge is for them and help them find a solution or support to improve their attendance. These students are also invited to join me with outside school activities during school breaks and summer programs, depending on available space. I was born and raised in Freeport, Texas and graduated from Brazos port High School, where I played the French horn and was on the color guard all four years. I received my Bachelors in Sociology from Stephen F Austin State University in 1998 and my Masters in Criminology from University of Houston- Clear Lake in 2005. I have been working with youth and their families, ages 10 to 18 for the past 19 years and have enjoyed watching them prosper and grow into productive young adults. During my professional career I have had many titles and jobs, such as Administrative Assistant, Substitute Teacher, Teen Court Coordinator, Campus Coordinator, Safe & Drug Free Schools and Communities Program Coordinator, Sr. Youth Intervention Program Coordinator, Juvenile Probation Officer, Residential Program Administrator and currently Juvenile Case Manager. In my free time I love spending time with my partner, my 16-year-old son, our 3 four-legged children, friends and family. We love to travel, go to the movies, have family game nights and camping. I am also a Mary Kay Independent Beauty Consultant for the last 3 years and just recently became a Pruvit Promoter. Thank you for reading about me and I wish many blessings to you and yours 😊

My name is Marisa Ramirez, I am the 10th grade English Writing teacher here at Worthing High School. I went to the University of Houston to earn my Bachelor's in English Literature with a minor in Education. I am currently working on getting my Master's in Education as a Reading Specialist. Before working at Worthing, I taught in Galveston. This is my third year of teaching overall and I look forward to many more successful years of teaching here at Worthing!



Mr. Tim Lazarus

I'm inspired by stories of the so called 'underdog'. During March Madness I enjoy seeing an upset. The odds were against my dad in 1957 when 5 of his family members died in the span of

less than a year. His older brother mysteriously drowned in a lagoon, influenza struck his younger sister, heart disease met his father, and his stressed out mother subsequently miscarried twins. Consumed by these tragedies, my dad failed his 8th grade exit exams. Broke and unable to afford high school, he shamefully stayed home and worked with his mom on the farm back in the village. Somehow, he got his hands on a Physics book and became consumed by it, reading it from cover to cover, and working out all the problems. My dad explained to his mom (who had no more than middle school education) that he wanted to understand how radios worked. The little money the family had was spent on getting my dad trained as an electrician. He later became instrumental during the Biafra War as he tapped the enemy's radio to provide advanced warning to the Biafra allies. He was later recruited out of Nigeria by the British Royal Air Force to study the radar in London and train in Scotland Yard. Aim high beyond your perceived circumstantial limits. This was a message my dad embodied and one in which I learned to embrace at an early age. In second grade we had this green Science book. We'd take turns reading one paragraph at a time out loud in class and answer reading comprehension questions. One day early in the year, I brought the book home and my dad asked where we were. After showing him, he said don't limit yourself to that slow pace and that I could've finished reading that whole book by now. Taking the challenge, I finished reading the rest of that Science book way ahead of the class. I had the immense opportunity to play NCAA Basketball at The University of Texas at Dallas, while earning a BS in Business Administration, and pursuing a 2nd degree in Statistics. I'm fascinated by Quantitative Business Analysis. Calculus and its applications to Physics and Engineering have been around since the 17th century. It wasn't until the 20th century when its usefulness was recognized in Business and Economic concerns, and the 21st century has seen heavier doses of useful analytics in sports. I've had an exciting professional career to this end. I was a business analyst at Chevron Corporation, an enterprise technology sales professional for another Fortune 500, and as an entrepreneur I witnessed my startup go from nothing to six figures in revenue. Fast forward to Fall 2018 and I'm fourth-year teaching. Weeks into teaching Statistics at Worthing, I had a student "FaceTime" me. While at home sick, she had a fellow classmate pass me their phone. Directly inquiring about what she missed and refusing to get behind, she characteristically grasped my green Science book and my dad's Physics book. That moment reinforced my why. My people say it takes a village to raise a child and I'm humbled to join a village of fellow staff who are equally committed to doing whatever it takes for each student to pull off an 'upset' and go beyond their perceived circumstantial limits.
