Dear Colts Family,

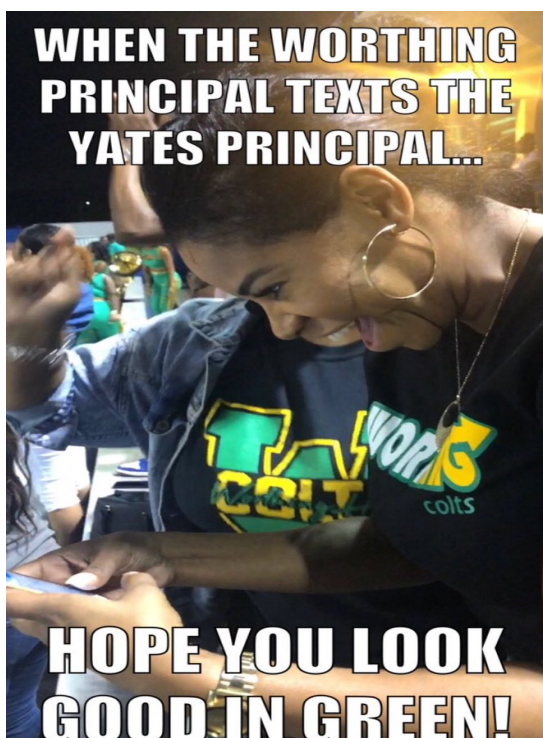

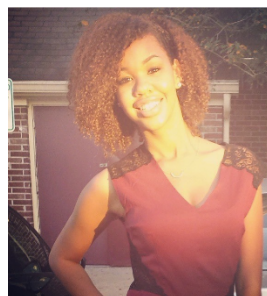
about advocating for students and helping them access the tools needed to be successful both in and outside of the classroom.

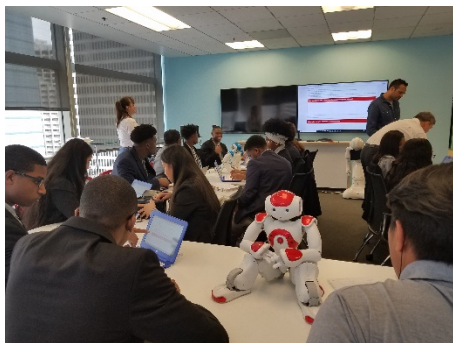

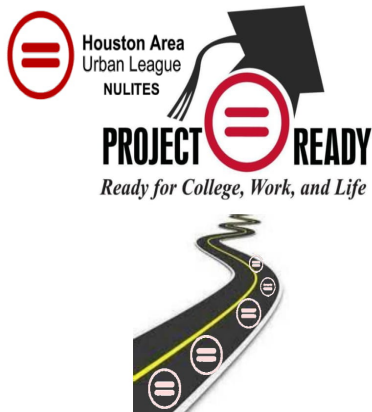

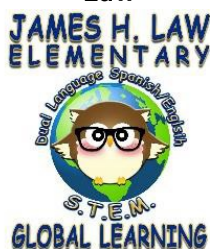
