What will we be learning in Grade 7 Texas History?

Grade 7 Social Studies will cover the history of Texas from Native Texans through the 20th Century. State objectives can be found at the https://tea.texas.gov/ website.

What is IB?

IB stands for International Baccalaureate. As an IB classroom students will work on interdisciplinary and individual activities that encourage the learner to become active, compassionate and lifelong learners who respect the global community.

Do you give tests?

Students will be assessed using quizzes and exams to gage student learning and comprehension. Each unit of study will be completed with an exam that will be recorded using IB criterion.

What learning resources will be used in class?

Primary and secondary sources will be analyzed throughout the course to develop deeper historical thinking about key events and details.

How will grades be taken?

Students will be assessed using the four IB criteria of Knowledge, Investigation, Communication and Critical Thinking. Each unit of study will be graded utilizing these criteria.

Can I get Extra Credit?

This course does not have "extra credit" assignments. If you are missing assignments it is the responsibility of the STUDENT to obtain the missing work and to complete it in a timely manner.

Where do I get my missing work?
