HONORING MEKEVA MCNEIL (THEATRE)

Mekeva McNeil first became a part of the HSPVA family as a member of the class of '96. She went on to study at the University of Houston and then later at the Actors Studio Drama School at Pace University where she received a Master of Fine Arts in Directing. She then returned to teach at HSPVA as a full-time member of the acting faculty. She passed away last year on June 13, 2021.

It's hard to find a place to begin when talking about the impact of Ms. McNeil on the lives of the students and community at HSPVA, but here I will share the stories of 2 senior Theatre majors in Dreamqirls who have worked with her.

TOMI AKINWANDE

"In 2019, when I auditioned for FELA! The Musical as a freshman, I had no idea the impact it would have on me. Ms.McNeil saw a determination in me. She took a chance on me, that I am forever grateful for. For me, Ms. McNeil connected to me most through her work in the All School Musicals. That is where I knew her most. When I auditioned for the role of Celie in The Color Purple, I remember being in that audition room and giving it my all. After the cast list came out, Ms. McNeil knew it bothered me. She came to me personally and we had a conversation about my participation in the show. What mattered was that she came to me, without me going to her first. She didn't feel like just a teacher. She listened to us, she understood what we were going through, and she laughed with us. She invited us into her garden. We got to see a glimpse of who she was, letting her guard down with us. I think the best moments I had with her were those times when we all sat in each other's company and told stories. We laughed, cried, screamed, supported, and loved each other. That is what Ms. McNeil taught me: to truly love every person I encounter and what it means to be a Black Woman in Theater."

GRANT EASON

"To this day, I struggle to articulate the extent of how much Ms. Mcneil affected me. I truly do believe that she had the ability to bring the best out of people, and I certainly attribute a lot of my evolution as an artist and person to the time I spent with her. My first show at PVA was Anonymous, and I could not have felt more overwhelmed. It was my first time doing sound design for a show and I thought that I could do it all by myself. When I finally admitted to her that I needed help, I expected her to be angry with me. Instead, she handed me a voice recorder and said "We need to record some shouting for this scene. You up for it?" So she opened the door to the recording studio, and I shouted into that recorder for fifteen minutes. After the show was over, she gave me a note that said "Never be afraid to ask for help." The Color Purple was the last show that I got to work on with her. After each rehearsal run, she would give us percentages of how impactful she thought it was. Our Spotlight performance, the best we thought we had ever done it, got a seventy-five! She always pushed us to go further. The final performance was the most emotional for all of us. After it was over, I sat crying in the dressing room. To my surprise, she came and found me. She gave me a hug and told me that she loved me. The time that I got to spend with Ms. McNeil was a blessing. Her artistry will always be an inspiration to me. She dedicated herself to creating theatre that brought people together, and I am constantly trying to continue her legacy through my own work."

I think I speak for many of the students who have taken a class or done a show with Ms. McNeil that what she taught us was more than technique; oftentimes, she showed us the intangible soft skills of kindness, confidence, and courage. She pushed us to move forward and to be unapologetic in our identities as theatre practitioners. She showed us how to be meaningful and diligent in every aspect of our art, from the practice to the product. And most of all, she demonstrated how to support one another, uplift one another, and be kind to one another.

On tonight's stage you will witness the talent of many artists. Many of whom were handpicked by Ms. McNeil when we first stepped foot in this school. She is the foundation upon which the artistry that fills this musical is set upon. She is the standard which many of us live to and aspire to fulfill. As we join together on a journey of Dreamgirls, a show that she was originally slated to direct last year, let us celebrate the life and legacy of Mekeva McNeil—creative visionary, fearless artist, caring teacher.
