#### SAFE GUN STORAGE

Dear Parent/Guardian:

The Houston Independent School District (HISD) is dedicated to a safe learning environment at school and at home. In the U.S., gun violence on school campuses is alarming. HISD recognizes that proper gun storage education and laws are essential to ensuring a gun-free campus. To further our efforts to protect students from firearms, and as a courtesy to our families, HISD is informing parents and guardians of the legal obligations to protect minors from negligent gun storage.

There are three steps to ensure safe gun storage:

- 1. Store firearms unloaded and locked.
- 2. Store and lock ammunition safely.
- 3. Keep others from getting access to stored firearms 24/7.

https://safegunstoragetexas.com/ for more details on ways to safely store a firearm. (Please note, your student will be provided with a paper copy of the flyer.) In addition, please review the state statute on gun storage laws summarized below:

Texas State Law 46.13: Making a Firearm Accessible to a Child In Texas, a "child" is defined as a person under the age of 17.

The statute indicates that a person commits an offense if a child gains access to a readily dischargeable firearm and charges the person with criminal negligence:

(1) failed to secure the firearm; or

(2) left the firearm in a place the person knew or should have known the child would gain access to.

- Establishes classroom practices that provide opportunities for most students to communicate effectively with the teacher and their peers
- Recognizes student misunderstandings and responds with an array of teaching techniques to clarify concepts
- Provides explanations that are clear and uses verbal and written communication that is clear and correct
- Ask remember, understand and apply level questions that focus on the objective of the lesson and provoke discussion
- Use probing questions to clarify and elaborate learning



stratesy to implement Turn and Talk

This strategy permits all students to participate in discussion, rather than only a few students participating in a class-wide discussion. All students can process new learning while engaging in meaningful conversation with a classmate.

#### How to Use

#### 1. Ouestion

Pose a question or prompt for students to discuss and tell them how much time they will have. A one-to-two-minute discussion is most productive.

#### 2. Turn

Have students turn to a specific partner. Partner assignments should be set up beforehand so that students can guickly and easily pair up.

#### 3. Talk

Set a timer for the allotted time, and have students begin discussing the assigned question or prompt. Use sentence stems when appropriate. When time is up, ask partners to share thoughts and ideas from their discussion to the class.

#### When to Use

Use Turn and Talk at any time during a lesson to encourage accountable talk:

-As a warm-up activity to discuss previous lesson -After five to seven minutes of oral or written input, to help student process what they have just heard or read

-During class discussions as a way for students to discuss ideas before sharing them with the class

-As a closing activity so that students can review what was learned in the lesson

-As a clarification tool for a complex problem or new guiding question posed by the teacher
