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Weekly Instructional Focus area

T-Tess 2.1: Achieving Expectations

- The teacher sets academic expectations that challenge all students.
- The teacher persists with the lesson until there is evidence that most students master.
- The teacher addresses student mistakes and follows through to ensure student mastery.
- The teacher provides students opportunities to take initiative of their own learning.

T-Tess 2.2: Content Knowledge and Expertise

- The teachers conveys accurate content knowledge in multiple contexts.
- The teacher integrates learning objectives with other disciplines.
- The teacher anticipates possible student misunderstandings.
- The teacher provides opportunities for students to use different types of thinking.
- The teacher accurately reflects how the lesson fits within the structure of the state standards.

T-Tess 2.3: Communication

- Establishes classroom practices that provide opportunities for **most students to** communicate effectively with the teacher and their peers
- Recognizes student misunderstandings and responds with an array of teaching techniques.
- Provides explanations that are clear and uses • verbal and written communication that is clear and correct
- Ask remember, understand and apply level questions that focus on the objective of the lesson and provoke discussion
- Use probing questions to clarify and elaborate learning

strategy for the week



QSSSA is an engagement strategy that ensures total participation and the use of academic language in all classrooms. It is a strategy designed to get students to use new academic language during student-student interactions. Ouestion

An engaging, open-ended question that will spark conversation

Signal

Students are provided with a signal which shows the teacher which students are ready to share (wait for 100%)

Stem

Stems are provided for all learners, teaches students to speak in complete sentences

Share

Students turn and talk with a partner or with their groups their thoughts

Assess

Assess students either by warm or cold call, call for volunteers. or write out their response

When to Use

Use any time during a lesson to encourage accountable talk: -As a warm-up activity to discuss previous lesson -After five to seven minutes of oral or written input, to help student process what they have just heard or read -During class discussions as a way for students to discuss ideas before sharing them with the class

-As a closing activity so that students can review what was learned in the lesson

-As a clarification tool for a complex problem or new guiding question posed by the teacher
