2022-2023 School Enrollment

Enrollment for the 2022-2023 school year has begun! Parents may choose to enroll their children at their zoned school or apply to select schools and programs throughout the district.

To get started, go to www.HoustonISD.org and click the top icon called 'ENROLL NOW. If using a mobile phone or tablet, click 'MENU.' Then, click 'STUDENTS & PARENTS,' and finally the 'How to Enroll in HISD' link.

You can also visit www.HoustonISD.org/Enroll.

If your student is new to HISD, complete the online enrollment application. Current students should submit the online Student Verification form. Transfer students should apply for a school transfer request through the Office of School Choice.
