100 Books Before High School Grades 6-8



Duration: 1 hour

Recommended: 1 session

Ideal Age: 12 and up

This class teaches science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) concepts by using LEGOs to introduce simple machines and renewable resources to Teens.

Graffiti Art

Group size: 25

Duration: 1 – 1.5 hours

Recommended: 1 session

Ideal Age: 12 and up

Students will learn the history of Graffiti artwork and the difference between Graffiti and vandalism. This course highlights where you are able to see graffiti artwork in Houston and includes an activity to teach students to create their own graffiti art on paper.

Light Painting

Ideal Age: 12 and up

This class teaches students to create works of art with light sources and photo apps on smart devices or tablets. This activity requires a class space without windows that can be darkened entirely.

Ideal Age: 12 and up

Students will learn how to be more than inventors; they will become designers by using various types of 3D modeling software. Students can take their 3D designs to an HPL TECHLink location and print them out at an onsite 3D printer.

Recommended: 1 session

Ideal Age: 5-7

Students will experience the joy of reading during an interactive story time. Includes songs and fingerplays, and followed by a simple craft to encourage creativity.

Ideal Age: 3-7



called Groomed for Literacy.
Groomed for Literacy aims to

address the literacy gap for underserved youth, with specific emphasis on young boys of color.

The mission of this program is to support barbers in serving as reading mentors and to distribute books to children in need.

Groomed for Literacy will increase the books available through the placement of Little Free Libraries stocked with books in barber shops. Supplying the communities in need with books, the program will increase public awareness literacy. Little Free Libraries will contain My Link library card applications and information on the nearest HPL library location and hours of operation.

Youths will be asked to sign in/log in each time they read a book in the barber shop or take a book home. Incentives (i.e., discount/free haircuts, new books for home library, etc.) will be provided by participating barbers and HPL based on books read.
