Mid-Year Assessments

Students completed the middle of the year (MOY) NWEA MAP assessments this week. Make-up testing for the NWEA MAP Assessment is scheduled Tuesday (1/22) - Thursday (1/24) of next week. Students who need to make up the tests will be tested as follows: Tuesday (Math), Wednesday (Reading), and Thursday (Science).

Kindergarten and first-grade students are currently taking the mid-year DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills) assessment, focusing on crucial reading skills. Your child's performance helps us tailor our teaching approach to ensure their continued progress. Your support is invaluable, and we appreciate your partnership in fostering a strong foundation for their literacy journey. The window for DIBELS testing is January 9th - January 31st. Our students are scheduled to complete the DIBELS testing by January 23rd.


