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

Virtual Learning foreword

The Houston Independent School District & Young Elementary have developed a plan to deliver quality education during the upcoming 2020-2021 school year while ensuring the health and safety of our students, families and staff.

With this in mind, all students will begin the 2020-2021 school year **virtually on September 8, 2020.**

Virtual instruction for all students will continue for six weeks through Friday, October 16, 2020. On Monday, October 19, 2020, face- to-face instruction for all students will begin. However, this date is subject to change based on COVID-19 conditions across the City of Houston and recommendations from local, state, and federal health officials.

We ask that parents work closely with individual schools to ensure their child is properly prepared to engage in online learning **virtually on September 8, 2020.** Please call your child's school directly with questions.

VIRTUAL LEARNING OVERVIEW

This school year, your child will begin school with virtual learning. This will allow HISD students to continue their education while HISD continues to monitor conditions across the district and make adjustments as necessary to ensure the health and safety of all students. During virtual learning, parents and students will be able to use HISD @ H.O.M.E. and district platforms to access instructional supports and resources.

Virtual learning in HoustonISD means that students will spend part of the day engaged in live online lessons with their teachers. The rest of the day will be spent working on virtual assignments *independently* at home.

Technology is used to:

- Deliver instruction to students
- Communicate with Teachers
- Does not require Real-Time Interactions (although it is highly recommended)

Students will need the following:

- 1) A Technology Device (laptop, Chromebook, or iPad)
- 2) Internet Access
- 3) HISD Log-in Information

Students will **be required** to engage in **daily** learning activities:

- 1) Live Interaction with Teachers
- 2) Participating in the HUB coursework
- 3) Submit Assignments to the teacher

HOW PARENTS CAN HELP CHILDEN SET UP VIRTUAL LEARNING

Supporting your student's Virtual Learning Experience is an ESSENTIAL part of their success while learning from home.

- 1) Set expectations and establish routines (schedule for child)
- 2) Create a dedicated learning space
- 3) Keep up with DeAnda & HISD's communication and updates
- 4) Check in with your child daily
- 5) Encourage physical activity & exercise
- 6) Become familiar with Virtual tools & resources

VIRTUAL INSTRUCTION: **ASYNCHRONOUS MODEL**

During the time that schools are closed, the District and Young ES will make every effort to ensure that student education continues uninterrupted. HISD will be implementing an asynchronous instructional model.

Asynchronous means:

- Teacher delivers regularly short increments of **synchronous** instruction through the use of real-time, live instruction via Teams
- Student's learning experience is exceedingly self-guided with intermittent teacher interaction in which students engage in learning instructional material on their own time.
- Students complete self-paced and personalized activities via the HUB and other district-provided digital resources (Imagine Learning, digital textbooks, etc.)

Parents and students will be provided with a **weekly instructional plan** with the learning activities students will be tasked to complete. Including:

- **Assignments:** During remote learning students will be graded on at least two assignments per week in each subject area.
- **Teacher and Student Interactions:** Opportunities for appropriate teacher-student and student-student interactions, that includes student feedback and reflection
- **Resources:** Instructions on **how** students can access resources that enrich the course content and assist in achieving mastery
- **Assessments:** Provide a variety of assessment opportunities that include student products. Assessments will ensure continued information on student progress remotely addresses accessibility concerns through all course materials

The HUB can be accessed from any device by visiting HoustonISD.org/HUB or downloading the itsLearning app on a mobile device.</p>

		<p>Use: To meet with teacher for "classtime" and face-to-face virtual learning.</p>
	<p>Teachers will use Microsoft Teams to provide live instruction and continued student support to enhance the learning experience through conversations, video and audio meetings, and live events. Students will be able to access Teams either through a shared teacher link or Office365.houstonisd.org.</p>

How to log-in



Students can log in to most digital resources by using their HISD network ID and password.

USERNAME:

Your student's username: Student\S##### or S#####@online.houstonisd.org

The #'s represent your student's ID Number. For example, Student\S123456 ****Make sure to use the backslash key and not the regular slash (\)****

PASSWORD:

Your student's default password: XXXXXXXX

The X's represent your student's 8-digit birthday For example: August 10, 2008 is 08102008

grades

Grades will count! Your student will follow the same grading system guidelines as in-person learning.

Teachers will be expected to measure student progress by grading at least **2 assignments** each week for each subject. Teachers will post grades on a weekly basis.

Additional information on grades:

- All HISD schools are now on a 6-week grading cycle
- Grades will be taken during each grading cycle of the 2020-2021 school year.
- **All** cycle grades will be used in the calculation of the final average for any class.
- Teachers will be recording grades, which will be available for parents and students to access through the HISD Connect Parent Portal (log-in information will be provided by campuses at a later date).

Attendance

Attendance will be taken on a daily basis.

All students enrolled at Young ES are expected to participate in learning activities daily – either virtual or in-person.

State law TEC §25.092 and Houston ISD Policy still require students to attend at least 90% of their classes to receive credit and be promoted. Remote attendance will count in the same manner as on-campus (face-to-face) attendance in satisfying this requirement.

Present

Students who are engaged in daily learning as defined below will be considered “present” and will not be marked absent.

To be marked present, students must engage in at least one of these 3 requirements each school day:

- Interactions with teachers via Microsoft Teams as part of live or small group instruction.
- Participation in the HUB, the HISD Learning Management System (LMS) and completion of independent reading and work assignments.
- Submission of assignment(s) via the HUB. When unable to submit via the HUB, students can submit assignments via emails, photos, phone conferences, or other forms of documentation.

Absent

Elementary students who have not met *at least one* of the three requirements above by the following times will be marked absent by 2:30 p.m.

However, absences can be resolved (changed to “present”) if the student engages in daily learning assigned by their teachers **by 11:59 p.m. that same day**.

Parents and students will receive absence notifications via School Messenger after 6:00 p.m. each day and will be reminded of the opportunity to resolve that day’s absence if the student engages in learning before 11:59 p.m. of the same day. Any absences recorded, but resolved by the student before 11:59 p.m. on the same day, will be reconciled based on login records of the HUB or with teacher verification.

Please note that students must do at least one assignment each day. Students may not complete work for other days and still be counted present for each day.

Ex. If a student is engaged in remote learning and completes learning activities for the entire week on Monday and does not log in for the remainder of the week, he/she will be marked “present” on Monday only and counted “absent” for Tuesday-Friday.

Student conduct



Maintaining excellent student conduct – **both in-person and virtually** - is an expectation at Young ES. Excellent conduct is necessary in achieving our goals of providing a safe school environment and ensuring the highest in student achievement.

Please look for detailed behavior and academic expectations from your child’s teacher. We ask that you regularly discuss talking about: appropriate online behavior, avoiding negative behaviors, and celebrate positive behaviors with your child.

Dress code

For this school year, HoustonISD has relaxed all campus dress code policies due to the current COVID-19 pandemic. However, it is expected that, whether in-person or online, all students must wear appropriate attire (for example: no vulgar language or pictures).

If possible, we encourage all students to wear a school uniform or plain color clothing (with no graphics) when attending in-person class.

During a normal school year, we strictly enforce our dress code of:

Literacy

We know effective reading and writing skills are **key components** to academic success. At Young ES, we always look for opportunities for students to read and write across content areas. Research shows that families that promote literacy at home will grow up to be better readers and do better in school. The best way for students to get better at reading is to read more!

At home, you can do your best to ensure your child is reading **at least 20 minutes a day** independently. If your child is learning to read, they can listen to you read a book to them, a sibling read to them, or listen to an online book. We encourage all students to use MyOn, which can be found through on HISD's digital resources.

Parent/school communication



We have many ways we communicate with parents: monthly calendars, notes home (in-person), school-wide phone calls, text messages, our school website, and social media (Twitter). Additionally, all teachers have conference periods and office hours where they are available to meet with parents. Teachers are available for conferences by phone during this time. If you call during the day, the teacher may not have a break until after school is out. Therefore, teachers make every effort to return phone calls within 24 to 48 hours
