Our class has covered a lot of material since school began. In Language Arts, we read classics such as "Little Boy Blue", "Jack and Jill", "Little Miss Muffet", "Humpty Dumpty", and "Diddle, Diddle, Dumpling." We began reading the words "I", "am", "a", "the", and "little." Throughout the school year, we will continue to review our alphabet letters, as well as the High Frequency Words (HFW), which will appear on tests. In Social Studies class, we discussed what needs and wants are. We also talked about our state! We learned that "Texas" means "friend," and we learned our state bird (Mockingbird), tree (Pecan), flower (Bluebonnet), and other trademarks of Texas (Cowboys!)

Please read with your children at least 20 minutes every day. Recipes are an excellent choice to read this month, because we reviewed the concept of capacity in Science class and greater than / less than in Math class. To understand capacity, we weighed sand in containers. To understand greater than / less than, we began decomposing numbers.
