Debate Team Preparing for 2018-2019

Westside Speech and Debate had an outstanding year this school year and they are gearing up to hit the ground running for 2018-2019. Students with an interest in politics, economics, or philosophy, or who wish to developing academic skills, such as research and presentation, are encouraged to join the team. Enrollment in the Debate class is strongly encouraged, and attending scheduled practices is mandatory.

The team competes in a wide variety of events throughout the year, including the University Interscholastic League (UIL), the Texas Forensic Association, the Houston Urban Debate League (HUDL), and many others. Debaters at Westside have had opportunities to compete at the local, state, and national levels. In addition to Houston area tournaments. Westside debaters traveled to Austin, Dallas, Washington D.C., and Fort Lauderdale, Florida during the 2017-2018 season. Last month, we had two teams compete at the UIL CX State Tournament; Andrew Moore & Kenneth Pinzon-Rojas, and Sherrod Session & Aymen Labidi.

There are a wide variety of speech and debate events to choose from and stu-

dents from all levels of experience are welcome to get involved. Speech events focus on the presentation of information in an informative or persuasive fashion. These are always done individually. Students are judged based on the content and presentation of their speech. Debate events follow various formats, but each debater has one speech during which they may state their position on a predetermined resolution without being interrupted by their opponent(s), one opportunity to question their opponent (s), and at least one speech to rebut their opponent's arguments while defending their own.

Boys Sub-Varsity Track Wraps Up Stellar Season

We are excited to share news about our Wolves' success at the 2018 UIL 18-6A JV and Freshmen District Track Meet Championships, which took place last Tuesday night at Barnett Stadium. Both the JV and Freshmen teams took home a team Second Place and earned silver medals.

Our freshmen boys met with success all around the Barnett Sports Complex. In the High Jump, Messiah Farinas placed first and received a gold medal, and Maties Honeycutt followed him up with a second place finish, earning a silver medal. Rounding out the field events for our freshmen, Jared Gay did an outstanding job in the disc throw and earned a bronze medal with a third place finish.

On the track, our freshmen Wolves 4X100 meter team comprised of Kylas Wright, Maties Honeycutt, Messiah Farinas, and Matthew Estrada, earned a silver medal. Our 4X200 meter team made up of Maties Honeycutt, Messiah Farinas, Kylas Wright, and Jordan Simms earned a silver medal, and our 4X400 meter team made up of David Pilsen, Maties Honeycutt, Zach Robinson, and Kylas Wright earned a silver medal. In the 110 meter and 300 meter hurdles, Matthew Estrada earned a bronze medal and David Pilsen put up a stellar time in the open 400 meter, earning a silver medal.

On the Junior Varsity side of the meet, the Wolves did an outstanding job as well. In the field events, Anthony Peterson-Lockett earned a silver medal in the high jump, Akeem Benjamin earned a silver medal in the long jump, Jalen Waddy earned a bronze medal in the shot put, and Johan Rodriguez rounded out the field events by earning a silver medal in the discus.

On the track, our JV relay teams showed extremely well. The 4X100 meter team, made up of Anthony Peterson-Lockett, Timothy White, Don Lawson, and Exilus Louis, earned a silver medal, our 4X200 meter team, made up of Akeem Benjamin, Tah Macbright, Anthony Peterson-Lockett, and Exilus Louis earned a silver medal, and our 4X400 meter team, made up of Nick Tinsley, Caleb Morgan, Don Lawson, and Tah Macbright, ended the night on a high note with a first place finish.

In the individual events Don Lawson earned a silver medal in the open 100-meter dash, Nick Tinsley earned a silver medal in the 800 meters, Ridwan Penn earned a bronze medal in the 800 meters, and Chad Knop earned a bronze medal in 300-meter hurdles. Tah Macbright earned a silver medal in the open 200 meters, and Caleb Morgan earned a silver medal in the open 400 meters.

We couldn't be more proud or our guys and all of the work they put in throughout the season. Go Wolves!
