The Environmental Systems classes took a trip last week to explore Buffalo Bayou from upstream to downstream. We rode the Sam Houston boat up and down the port of Houston to see the refineries and ships which make Houston the Energy Capital of the US. We tested the water quality both at the Port and also in two locations upstream. Lunch break was at the Finca Tres Robles urban farm on the east side. Students enjoyed a sunny lunch, a little soccer and a tour of this profitable local business. After lunch, we stopped at Allen's Landing down town where the city of Houston began. This site was chosen because the confluence of Buffalo and White Oak bayou was a wide enough port to allow sizeable ships to load sugar, cotton and timber, then turn around and head back out to Galveston Bay and points of sale beyond.

• JV State Champs in the Contemporary, Jazz, Hip Hop and Open Categories


- COED State Champs in the Contemporary, Jazz, Hip Hop and Open Categories


