“ We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights; that among these are life , liberty , and the pursuit of happiness .” These inspiring words were written in the Declaration of Independence by the third president of the United States, Thomas Jefferson.

Thomas Jefferson was born April 2, 1743 in Shadwell, Virginia to Peter Jefferson and Jane Randolph. When he was 14 years old, his father died. He inherited all of the land his father then owned. At the age of 29, he married Martha Wayles Skelton and they had six children. Sadly, she passed away after just ten years of marriage.

Thomas Jefferson had an outstanding political career, after first practicing as a lawyer. He was the nation’s third president, George Washington’s Secretary of State, John Adam’s Vice

President, the Governor of Virginia, and a member of the Continental Congress. He had a great impact on the shaping of our new government and the American dream.

However, Thomas Jefferson is also a controversial character. No one is perfect, yes not even you, and Thomas Jefferson was not perfect either. He owned 200 slaves, with almost half under the age of 16. Many of these lived at his beloved Monticello, his famous estate located in Virginia.

He did free several slaves during his life, but this was obviously not one of the better things he did in his life.

Overall, I think it is safe to say, that the United States of America would not be the same without Thomas Jefferson. He has become popular again thanks to the Tony-award-winning musical “HAMILTON,” coming to the Hobby Center soon.

BEFORE YOU TAKE YOUR DOG ON A WALK, CHECK THE TEMPERATURE

It is very important to make sure your dog does not get overheated. Dogs can only pant to cool themselves off, which is very inefficient. Taking your dog out on a hot day can give your dog heat stroke, which can be very harmful, or even burn your dog's pads (the skin under the foot). Heat stroke is a dangerous condition in which temperature regulating mechanisms fail, resulting in fever and/or unconsciousness. It can be very difficult to recover from heat stroke.

The maximum recommended temperature to walk your dog is around 80 degrees fahrenheit. That is even pushing it. Imagine you were wearing a fur coat - it's good in cold weather but a difficulty in hot weather. Would you want to go outside during Houston summers



wearing a fur coat? Overweight, aging and short nose breeds, like pugs and bulldogs, are at a higher risk for heat stroke. During summer time, it is recommended to take your dog on short walks before the sun comes up and after the sun goes down.

Heat stroke could potentially be dangerous to your furry friend.

Even if you don't think it is hot outside, your dog might think differently. Remember, dogs can't sweat and they are constantly wearing a furry jacket they can't take off. Before you take your dog outside, check the temperature!

What day around April 15 stresses parents out every year? If you guessed Tax Return Day you are correct!

In this article you will learn about why we pay taxes and what tax returns are.

Why do we pay taxes? One reason we pay taxes is because it is considered a civic duty.

If you don't pay taxes you could be fined or even be put in prison! It also pays the salary of government workers

and supports common resources such as firefighters and police. Plus, they are used to keep roads in good condition and fund government programs.

Tax returns are when you give your due taxes back to the IRS. Tax day falls on April 15, unless it ends up on a weekend which in that case it is usually on the following Monday or Tuesday (i.e. This year Tax Return day is on April 17). Tax returns are based upon a family's income. If you have no job or earn very little money you do not have to pay taxes. People prepare tax returns to send to the IRS. If you have paid extra in taxes the previous year the government will repay you a back.

As you have learned, taxes are very important. Taxes and tax returns are good to know about later in life. And don't forget... April 17 is coming soon!

Ciao! Greetings from Italy.



Did you know this recipe was made by one of the writer's grandmother? It is one of the best lasagna recipes out there. If you love this Italian food, continue reading.

"Friendship" meat lasagna

Ingredients:

- 1 box of lasagna noodles
- 2 1/2 lbs. of ground beef

- 2 lbs. of shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 white onion
- 3 ripe tomatoes
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 1 red pepper
- 1/2 cup of ketchup (secret ingredient!)
- 1 tablespoon of olive oil
- Salt and pepper
- Optional: thyme and paprika

Beef Lasagna Sauce:

Cooking Directions:

In a saucepan with the spoon of olive oil sauté the ground beef until it is done. To make the sauce, blend the cut onion, tomatoes, red pepper, garlic, ketchup, and all the seasonings. (if you

wanted to add the thyme and paprika) Add the sauce to the meat and simmer at low heat for 15 minutes.

Béchamel Sauce:

Ingredients:

- 3 cups of milk
- 1 tablespoon of butter
- 4 tablespoons of flour
- 1/2 white onion
- 1 can of cream milk
- Salt and pepper

Cooking Directions:

Boil two cups of milk; separately in the blender and mix the third cup of milk with the cut onion, butter, flour, cream of milk and salt and pepper. Blend well and add the sauce to the boiling milk. Stirring continuously let it boil for 5 minutes.

Lasagna noodles:

Cook lasagna noodles according to package directions

Assembly:

Grease a baking pan. Arrange a first layer of noodles, then add a layer of the cooked beef lasagna sauce, béchamel sauce and mozzarella cheese. Add a second alternating layer of pasta, the meat sauce, béchamel sauce and cheese. Cover the pan with aluminum paper and bake at 350 degrees for about 25 - 30 minutes. Remove the aluminum paper and broil for 5 minutes.

Voilà! Now you have a scrumptious dish waiting for you to eat. Bon Appétit!

In the Texas Spirit Theater, you could take a journey through Texas history with the film, Star of Destiny or you

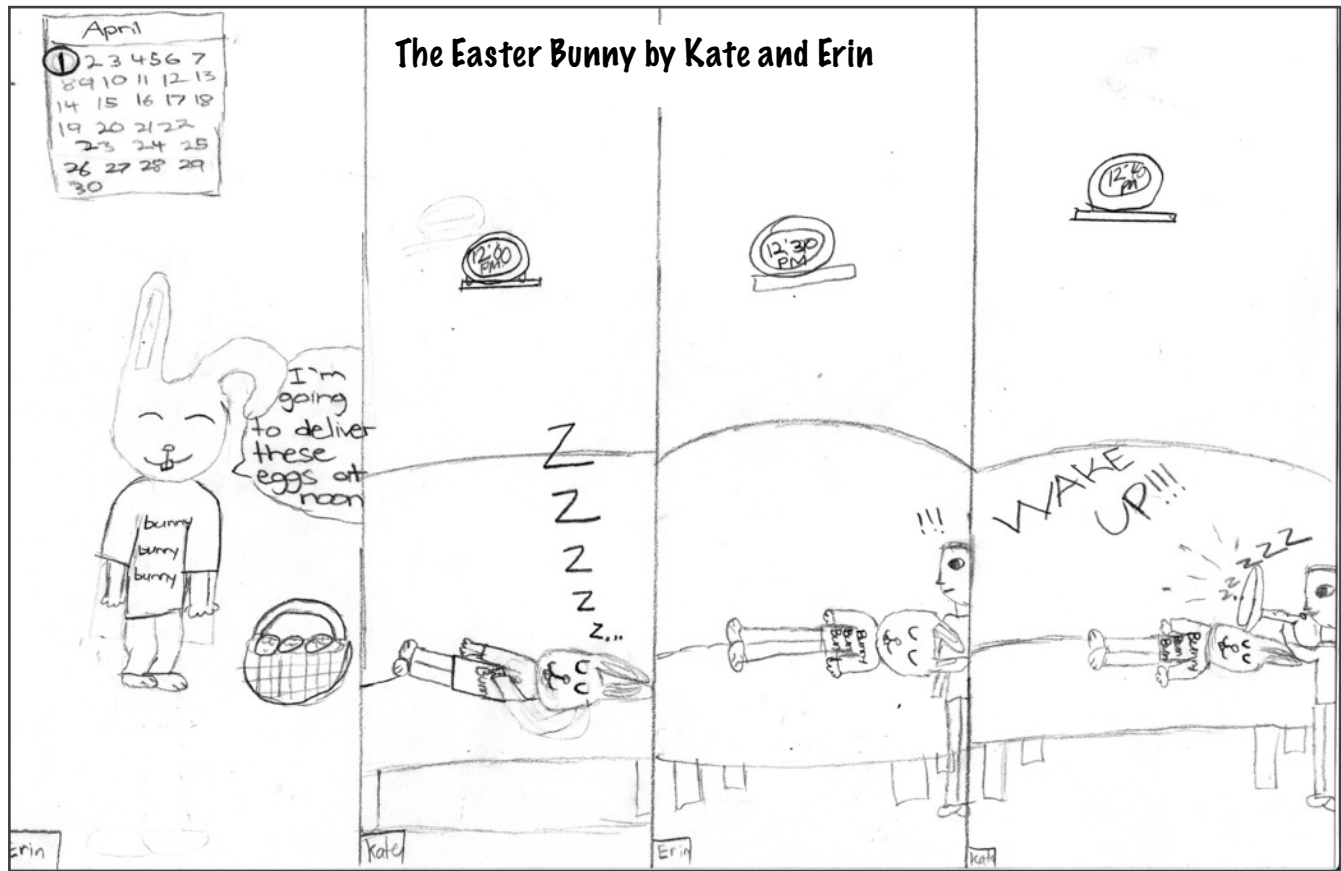
