



1Million Project and Sprint Guardian

Sprint and the Sprint Foundation are partnering to make devices and service available for schools and non-profits across the country, benefiting 1 million high school students over a five-year period as part of the 1Million Project. Included with this offering is the Sprint Guardian content filter, which helps ensure the safety and security of the students' wireless experience while on the Sprint Network.

Here's how it works:

When students use their devices on the Sprint Network, Sprint Guardian checks out the destinations the user is trying to access, to determine whether the site contains adult content.





- If there is adult content, the content is blocked and the user gets a corresponding message.
- Sprint Guardian will filter and block content as needed while on the Sprint Network.
- If the device is used on Wi-Fi (not on the Sprint Network), the Sprint Guardian content filter will not be active on the device. The Sprint Guardian solution works only on the Sprint Network.
- Once the student leaves the school, Sprint
 Guardian will filter and block content as needed
 while on the Sprint Network. The content filter
 will always be on and cannot be disabled.

Note: Sprint Guardian cannot block image results from search engines such as Google, Bing or Yahoo. Image results from some queries may result in thumbnail/previews of adult content. Clicking on these results will take the user from the search site to a destination webpage that can be blocked by the content filter.

- The user can turn on the "Safe Search" option in the search engine to block these results from appearing.
- Sprint Guardian also will block access to known malware and phishing sites designed to infect your device or trick users into giving personal information to malicious parties.
