**M. E. Foster Elementary School
Parent Involvement Policy 2018-2019**

If students are to be successful, their parents or guardians must be actively involved in their education. Foster Elementary School has developed this policy to describe how we involve parents in the development of policy and the School-Parent-Teacher Compact.  - ❖ Title I meetings and Family Nights throughout the year (virtual or in person)
