Dr. Zapata welcomed all and celebrated some of the positive events going on at WHS with students competing in state events ect.

There was also a brief overview of the different tests coming up during the spring semester, including, but not limited to TELPAS, STAAR, School Day SAT.

Also included in the spring semester schedule are some required drills (lockdown) and upcoming uniform, ID, and tardy sweeps.

Next upcoming projects were shown and discussed. Those images shown were examples only and not the definite outcome of the project. Helen Tran was present to discuss some of the costs and timelines of the project

- 1. Wrapping the outside windows/doors for safety to make it more difficult to see right into the school. This would also aid in being able to find things like the gym when visiting campus for events.
- 2. The softball field is newly renovated. And now it needs water to be able to maintain the refurbishment
- 3. Doors are being considered for the bathrooms in the building for safety and crowd control during lunch and the first and last 15 minutes of each class. Some parent representatives expressed concern about locking bathrooms when students may need them. They parents were assured this was a crowd control, hall walking issue and bathrooms would still be available.
- 4. Other projects contain a drainage or flooded area behind the baseball field, an outdated Marquee, and landscaping, and a portion of the football field that is torn up.

Towards the end of the meeting a parent representative explained his attendance at an Energy Corridor Constables meeting. One of the topics of notes was complaints from the community about Westside H.S. and Westbriar M.S. students at Walgreens and Kroger after school and the possible increase of crime at these times. Another meeting is coming up soon and SDMC members were encouraged to attend as administrators of WBMS would also be there to explore possible solutions

A teacher, Mrs. Wadih, also spoke up to thank the administration for continuing with tardy sweeps as it has helped classroom management and created fewer interruptions throughout the day.
