Logging into Naviance. The Naviance tabs include Career, College/scholarships, About Me, and a Course tab. The career Interest Profiler is one of the activities for your student to do in Naviance. After answering the questions in the activity a list of careers are provided to the student based on the student's personality and interests.

- 1. Click on the "careers" tab on the Family Connection.
- 2. Click on the link for "career interest profiler".
- 3. Click on the "start Profiler" button to begin.
- 4. Answer the questions to complete the assessment.
- 5. Click on "view results" when the activity is completed. Take some time to read the results.
- 6. Begin exploring! Use the results to begin exploring careers that are of interest. You can explore links on the careers tab.

Credit Recovery Intervention Plan

Sharpstown International School offers students a themed curriculum which is personalized. The PGP and other data are used to identify the students who need intervention. Please monitor your students grades in grade speed to help them to be academically successful.

Work with your student's teachers to partner in providing your child the best education. Students are required to attend tutorials if they are not successful in their coursework. Check your student's progress while doing homework. Academic success for our students will be evident as they advance from grade to grade. Saturday School is also provided in the Spring semester as an added intervention.

Our school will begin our Credit Recovery Program in the Spring to accommodate students who were not successful during their Fall semester. The students enrolled in Credit Recovery will be able to recover lost credits through successful completion of their coursework.
