Dear Parents,

Regular school attendance and academic engagement play essential roles in your child's success and well-being. But did you know chronic absenteeism can lead to academic setbacks?

Over the course of just one year, those missed learning opportunities can lead to poor reading and math skills. When those impacts are compounded over an academic career, it can prevent students from graduating.

This month, the Houston Independent School District is launching "Be Present. Don't Miss Out," an educational campaign designed to raise awareness about the importance of being actively engaged in learning, whether face-to-face or virtually.

As we begin the second semester, ensuring your student is present and actively participating, connected, and focused every day — whether face-to-face or online — is key to finishing the year strong.

Every missed day is a missed opportunity to learn. It's also a missed opportunity to reap the benefits that come from a quality education, like access to post-secondary vocational and academic programs and a leg up when competing for high-paying, in-demand jobs.

We understand, especially during a pandemic, that students sometimes get sick and family emergencies happen. We ask that you continue to monitor your students' health and keep them home if they're sick.

But when they're healthy, please make sure they're in school — whether that's in a classroom or at home learning virtually. We need them present and engaged.

They can connect you with a variety of community resources, including mental and physical health services and food and housing assistance.
