Step 2: Once your application is completed you will see Pending Review on the screen.

Step 3: An email regarding your approved status will be sent to your email address within 2-3 weeks. If you do not receive an email, please follow-up with your designated school's VIPS Coordinator.

Step 4: Once you are APPROVED to volunteer, you are eligible to volunteer in any HISD school(s) for the current year.

This volunteer registration is REQUIRED to attend FIELD TRIPS, Volunteer IN THE CLASSROOM or any other volunteering that involves interacting with students.

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Community Circle Time Comes To Longfellow

Circles are a safe community time where you can share and talk freely with your fellow classmates. Students and their teacher gather in a circle with a given topic. Most circles start with a quote or poem and then the teachers ask a few questions that everyone has the opportunity



to answer. Circles usually have a talking piece to pass around and items to put in the middle of the circle that represent the students and the teacher. Some of the rules of Circles are: Be honest, Don't judge, No laughing at others, Be respectful, and Don't talk without the talking piece. The purpose of circles is to build community and trust within the classroom, to allow students who may be more shy or quiet to express themselves, and to address issues that may arise. "It can feel hard or scary to share in circles sometimes, but it has gotten easier over time," says 5th grader, Samiyah Green. "For me circles can be difficult because it's hard for most students to share real stuff," says 5th grader Kaylyn Newcomb. The hope is that Circles would help build relationships and create a more positive environment.
