Shirts	Uniform Polo, Oxford or school t-shirt with HSLJ Logo	
Undershirts	Writing is not visible	Navy blue, white, grey, black
Pants	Twill/Khaki/Dickie/Docker/Denim style pants. No rips, holes, embellishments, low-rise, rolled up, patches or frayed hems. No leggings, yoga pants or tights of any kind.	Navy blue, black, or Khaki Pants – <i>(Denim/Blue Jeans are not permitted)</i>
Skirts/shorts	Knee-length shorts/skirts with no slits, must not be shorter than one inch above the knee.	Navy blue, black, or Khaki Pants – <i>(Denim/Blue Jeans are not permitted)</i>
Jackets (traditional zip)	HSLJ logo only or no visible logo, solid color.	Navy blue, white, grey, black
Hoodies (pullover) Sweatshirts (pullover) Sweaters	HSLJ Logo/Approved club, or solid color with no visible logo. Sweatshirt hoods will not be worn when in the building.	Navy blue, white, grey, black
Shoes	Closed toe and closed heel. No sandals, crocs or croc style, flip flops, slides or house shoes.	Any color
Other	Student ID Badges or a Temporary Student ID Badge must be visible at all times. No headgear (hats, sunglasses, bandanas, du-rags, etc.) Proper hygiene and grooming applies to all students. Clear Backpacks Only, No backpack purses.

Tops	Approved Spirit Shirt, HSLJ issued club, organization, or class t- shirt or college shirt	
Professional Attire/Career Attire -Certain days will be designated as professional or career attire days. Professional attire is conservative in nature and does not include denim, skirts above the knee, exposed shoulders, t-shirts, facial piercings, etc.
