



HIGH SCHOOL FOR LAW & JUSTICE DRESS CODE 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR

The High School for Law & Justice is charged with the responsibility of maintaining an atmosphere conducive to learning. Student success depends in part on how students perceive themselves and how others perceive them.

ITEM	REQUIREMENTS
SHIRTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students may NOT wear low-cut blouses, blouses or shirts that expose the <u>midriff</u> when standing or sitting, blouses with bare backs, see through, tube tops or spaghetti straps. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> As a rule of thumb, straps of undergarments and any part of a student's body from collar bone through the mid-thigh must NOT be visible at any time.
PANTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students may wear dress pants/khakis or jeans of any color. Students may NOT wear baggy, sagging or RIPPED PANTS OF ANY KIND. No rips, holes, embellishments, low-rise, rolled up, patches or frayed hems. Students may NOT wear stretch pants, sweatpants, joggers, YOGA pants, or tight-fitting bottoms of any kind
SKIRTS/SHORTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <u>Skirts and dresses</u> MUST have a length within <u>one inch</u> of the knee. Must be worn with shorts under. <u>Shorts</u> may only be KHAKI/CARGO style and have a length within <u>one inch</u> of the knee. Students may NOT wear athletic shorts.
HOODIES SWEATSHIRTS SWEATERS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students may NOT wear hoods from hoodie/sweatshirt at any time while in the building If wearing a Hoodies/Sweatshirts, student must wear a shirt/blouse underneath.
SHOES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students may NOT wear flip-flops, Crocs, slip-on sandals or house slippers since they pose a safety concern. Tennis shoes, boots, and/or sneakers are appropriate.
OTHER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students may NOT wear facial piercings except for nose studs. If students have facial piercings, they may wear a clear, flat one. Students may NOT wear any caps, hoods, bandanas (religious provisions allowed) Students may NOT wear sunglasses while indoors. Students may NOT wear pajamas or other sleep attire. Students may NOT wear jewelry, clothing, or accessories promoting sex, drugs, alcohol, violence, crime, or gangs.
MANDATORY UNIFORM POLO	<p>EACH STUDENT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR PURCHASING ONE HSLJ POLO TO WEAR DURING DESIGNATED PROFESSIONAL DRESS DAYS. POLO CAN ONLY BE PURCHASED FROM THE HSLJ PTO.</p>

Students are expected to follow the dress code. Students in violation of the dress code will be expected to correct the violation. Students refusing to correct the dress code violations are subject to further disciplinary action as outlined in the *HISD Code of Student Conduct*.

Transportation

- If your child misses the bus and does not attend school, that will be considered an unexcused absence.
- Riding the HISD bus is a privilege, and it is ultimately the responsibility of the parent to ensure that the child attends school every day.

- A video-monitoring system is used on buses, and the video may be used as a basis for determining disciplinary action. Should the above rules be broken, students shall be reported to an appropriate school administrator, and discipline may be imposed in accordance with the [HISD Student Code of Conduct](#). **Transportation services can be discontinued at any time per the HISD Student Code of Conduct.**

Food Delivery/Closed Campus

- No food delivery is allowed – no matter who orders it. Any food that is delivered will be held in the front office until dismissal. No exceptions.
- Students may not leave campus to purchase lunch/food.
- Students may bring lunch, eat free school lunch, and/or purchase snacks.
- Microwaves will be made available for students to use during lunch.

Early Departure

- We understand there may be times you will need to pick up your child early from school. Please note that all high school students require 90% attendance for a semester to receive credit.
- Students may not be picked up early on a regular basis. If this occurs too often, a meeting will be requested by the principal to determine if any assistance is needed.
- Students may not be picked up within the last 30 minutes of school, this is standard across all HISD campuses. Students may not be picked up after 3:10pm.

Test Information

Whole Course Credit

- If you do not earn credit for a course, there is still hope through Whole Course Credit
- For classes that are two-parts, A and B, your semester average combined can help you earn credit for both parts
- Semester 1 Average + Semester 2 Average = **Average of 70 or better would receive WCC**

GPA – Grade Point Average

Grade Point Averages are on a 4.0 grading scale.

Every grade earned in HS is figured into the GPA.

Only courses that are designed as AP receive quality grade points. Graded on a 5.0 scale

To calculate the GPA, divide the total number of grade points by the total number of grades on the transcript.

HISD Advanced or AP Course

- AP and PAP students are also rewarded with an extra point on their GPA.

For example:

Student A – English 1 Semester Grade: A GPA points: 4

Student B – Pre-AP English 1 Semester Grade: A GPA points: 5

Growth Plan

- Students participating in a Magnet program who are experiencing difficulties in meeting the standards of their Magnet Program Entrance Agreement are placed on Probationary Status and on a Magnet Program Growth Plan for a minimum amount of time of one grading cycle.
- A student should be placed on a growth plan after initial steps have been taken to assist the student at the first indication of struggle.
- This growth plan is intended to help students meet program expectations as outlined in the Entrance Agreement.
- A growth plan committee, comprised of the student's teacher(s), parent/guardian, the Magnet Coordinator and an administrator, will evaluate the student's progress on this plan at the end of the specified time period to determine if the magnet transfer will be renewed for the 2021-2022 school year.



Create an assignment log.


Attend mandatory tutorials once a week for each class that is below satisfactory.

Cheating

- Looking on someone else's paper during a test or quiz
- Giving or getting information about a test or quiz before or while taking it
- Looking in the book or at notes during a closed-book test or quiz
- Collaborating with someone on an assignment or project unless such work has been specifically cleared with the teacher in advance
- Getting information from someone under false pretenses
- Using inappropriate technology during assignments and assessments

Plagiarism

- Copying sentences or parts of sentences manually or electronically from someone else's writing without proper credit, and/or writing someone else's idea(s) without giving the source credit for the original idea(s).
- Any student who is aware of another student's violation is also practicing academic dishonesty and is obligated to report the student to the teacher.

Result

1. Referral to administrator by way of written report
2. Administrator confers with student and/or teacher to establish appropriate action
3. Written or oral notification of action is sent to parent. Notification is sent to the teacher indicating action taken.
4. Discipline Referral Form is retained by the administrator for personal record
5. Level II behavior violations and discipline options/responses are not limited to those provided
6. Repeated violations shall result in a more severe response and/ or referral to Level III

Cell Phone

- Confiscated cell phones will be placed in the Principals office and will not be available for pick-up until after 3:40 p.m.
 - HISD policy requires a fee for the return of cell phones- \$15
 - Parents/legal guardians might be required to pick up the confiscated items.
- HSLJ is not responsible for lost or stolen electronic devices.

COVID Updates

- COVID vaccine **is not required**.
- Masks are not mandated at this time. Your child may choose to wear a mask.
- Nursing judgement when determining probable case.
- Suspected cases of COVID will be waiting in the isolation room. If suspected, you must come and pick them up from school.
- Last year, testing on campus (with parental consent) was an option. We do not know if that will be available at this time.

Immunizations

- You must be up to date on all immunizations required by the state of Texas or have the appropriate exemption paperwork. To learn which immunizations are required, see the following website:

- If I do not have this, you can be excluded from school. I will be going over all immunization records next week before the start of school. If your child is deficient with an immunization, I will contact you. If you know you are lacking a necessary immunization, please get it now to avoid delays.

Most common reasons for clinic visits

- Headache
- Stomach pain nausea
- Menstrual cramps
- Sore throat/cold/cough
- Mental health (panic attack, suicidal ideation, depression)
- Fatigue
- Injuries (cuts, abrasions, falls, head injury, sprains, artificial nail trauma)

Medications

- **You cannot bring over the counter medications to school.** Examples- allergy meds, ibuprofen, cold/cough medicine, aspirin, etc.
- If you have prescription meds you need to take at school, I will need a) a doctor's order that is signed by doctor and a parent, b) med that is labeled by a pharmacy. The med must be stored in the clinic under lock and key and administered by me.
- **All medications require the appropriate paperwork from the doctor.**
- If your child is going to have a procedure (wisdom teeth removal for example), get physician order forms from me prior to appointment.

Medications

- The **only self-carry medications** are asthma inhalers and Epi-Pens. Again, to carry these, I must have orders signed by doctor and parent.
- Common meds students often need: ADHD/ADD meds, insulin or diabetic meds, ibuprofen, Epi-Pens and/or antihistamine, anxiety meds, migraine meds.
- Please address this now if you know you need medications. Please see me for required forms/paperwork.
- Medication orders must be renewed each new school year.
- You may come to campus to administer a medication.

Sending students home

- As much as possible, we want students to be in class. I am not frivolous in calling a parent to pick up their child. I only do it if I have to (exclusion criteria is met) or I believe the student should be taken to the doctor.
- Please do not send your child to school if they are sick.
- You have the right to come pick up your child from school when you want. For it to be excused as a medical issue, I must be the one who sends them home.

Exclusion Criteria

Determined by Texas Department of State Health Services

- Covid
- Diarrhea
- A temperature of 100° Fahrenheit, (37.8° Celsius) or higher. (may not return for 24 hours without fever-reducing medicine)
- Vomiting
- Streptococcal Sore Throat and Scarlet Fever
- Communicable diseases (Covid, Flu, Meningitis, Measles, etc.)
- Conjunctivitis, Bacterial or Viral (Pink eye)
- Live head lice (they may return with nits)

What I Do Not Have:

- OTC meds- No cough drops, cough syrup, pain meds, eye drops, allergy meds
- Food
- Bottled water
- Pregnancy tests
- Condoms
- Oxygen
- Extra inhalers
- Extra Epi-pens

What I Do Have:

- Ice Packs
- Heat Packs
- Nail clippers
- Bandages , ACE wraps, first aid supplies
- AED
- Crutches, wheelchairs
- Uniforms
- Toiletries

Menstrual Cramps

- Girls often come for menstrual cramping. I do NOT have meds that I can give without previously discussed criteria.
- I do not have a heating pad though I do have heat packs I can heat and reheat for you. All packs must be returned to me.
- If your child has painful cramps, you may want to get medication orders.
- **I do not send students home for cramping.**

Feminine Hygiene Products

- Feminine hygiene products are available in the girls' restrooms. There is a charge of 25 cents.
- I have some donated products but the supply is very limited.
- Please encourage your student to bring extra supplies just in case.

9th Graders

Username: S + ID Number

- For example, S123456

Password: Your 8 – digit date of birth (no slashes or dashes)

- If you were born on August 1st , 2000; it would be 08012000
- If you were born on October 12, 1999; it would be 10121999

Reminders

- The first time you log in, you need to be on the HISD network meaning that you need to be on the HSLJ campus.
- If you get a message that says, “There are currently no logon servers available...” raise your hand for assistance.
- If you have recently registered, it may take 24-48 hours for your ID to be processed into the student information system. You won’t be able to logon until that process is completed.






